army, numbering hundreds of thousands of men, back in such disorder that even apparently impregnable positions, such as those along the rivers Alt and Argechu, could not be held more than a few hours.

The line of the Argechu river, with its flooded, dashing torrent, 300 yards to a quarter of a mile wide, forming a natural defense, appeared to be so strong that the Germans themselves expected this last line of defense before Bucharest would require time and hard effort to force. But the river was crossed both to the north and to the south of the city almost without breaking the stride of the advancing armies.

Advance Most Rapid.

The advance of the Tenthent forces in western Rumania has been so rapid that the military staffs have been forced to change their bases at intervals of only a few days to keep up with the troops and to lay plans for settling in towns not yet captured.

The journey began at Livizeny, just within the Hungarian frontier, with Craiova as the first objective.

The next objective was Karkulu, but it had fallen, together with Slavina, by the time the correspondent could arrive, and even the headquarters troops were moving.

The thrust developed by the Serbians in the Grun-site region, east of Monastir, is being pressed, and the latest statement from the Serbian war office announced the Bulgarians in retreat after they had lost several strongly fortified positions.

ROGUE RIVER ANGLING

WE who live in small or isolated communities frequently lose our perspective. A distorted vision magnifies little things into great ones. Trifling affairs loom gigantic on the horizon of our thoughts.

Some of our banks, hotels and business men, upon request of intolerant and impatient anglers, have gone on record in favor of destroying the principal industry, with the largest payroll, in southern Oregon, the chief resource of the people of Curry county, in order to provide better sport for recreation seekers in Jackson county.

The drastic program sought is not only undemocratic, but unjust. It cannot be defended upon moral or ethical grounds. Nor is there any commercial defense.

We all would like to see better angling in our streams, particularly in the Rogue river. Commercial fishing for trout and steelhead is already prohibited by law—and the Rogue is the only stream in Oregon in which steelhead fishing is thus prohibited.

For many years steelhead and salmon were both plentiful in Rogue river. Both were taken commercially, not only at the mouth of the stream, but along its entire length.

Let the fishermen and the business men, instead of quixotically attacking industry and confiscating investment, spend a similar amount of energy and money in preserving the young fish from being wasted over alfalfa fields and orchards by having all ditches screened.
