1. A proposed Charter Amendment of the Charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, to enable the City Council of said city to lay and construct pavement in and upon the streets and thoroughfares of said city; to create a pavement construction, maintenance and redemption fund and to authorize a millage tax to provide the same; to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and time warrants in addition to the warrants and bonds authorized in Section 72 and 72a of said City Charter; to define such public pavement; to provide for the payment of all indebtedness for the actual cost of constructing or laying all public pavement; to provide for the maintenance and redemption fund and to authorize a millage tax to provide the same; to limit payment and refunds for such public pavement construction to the actual cost thereof, and to owners of property subject to general taxation; to provide for the sale of said bonds and the distribution of warrants; to authorize the question of issuing bonds and time warrants to be submitted to an election of the people, and to authorize the said City Council to pass ordinances to carry into effect the provisions of this Charter Amendment; and to provide that the bonds and time warrants authorized hereunder shall be redeemed by a special and limited tax levied in addition to the limitation of the taxes and levies provided by Section 65 of the said city charter.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MEDFORD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That the charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto the following section: Section 140. (a) The City Council, under the power vested in it by the City Charter of the City of Medford, and especially Section 65 and 78 of said charter, may levy a special pavement and street improvement tax not to exceed twenty mills on the dollar on the taxable property within the corporate limits of the city at the time of making out the annual budget as provided for by this charter, and as a part of the total city levy. Said tax levy shall be special and in addition to the ten (10) mill tax limitation contained in Section 65 of this Charter, and the money derived from said special levy shall be kept in a separate fund and be used for constructing such street pavement, and maintaining such pavement as is now or may hereafter be constructed, and not otherwise; and for repayment of paving assessments heretofore paid under assessment ordinances of said city as hereafter provided; and for redemption purposes; and for no other purpose. The City Council shall not lay down or construct any new pavement in or upon any street or alley in the City of Medford until such a time as the improvements and the advanced assessed value warrants same. (b) All pavement laid and constructed by the City of Medford, whether by special assessments or otherwise, and laid and constructed under city contracts at the expense of the abutting property by special assessments, and also such other pavement as may have been heretofore constructed by special assessment by the council, and such pavement as may have been constructed by special assessment against the abutting property, and such pavement as has been laid and constructed and paid for by private subscription or by individuals, and which pavement has been accepted

ed by the city, and such pavement as may hereafter from time to time be laid or constructed by the city, are hereby declared to be public necessities and a benefit and improvement to the city at large and to each and every individual piece of property therein, and the laying and constructing thereof is hereby ratified and confirmed, and the total actual cost of the same is hereby assumed by said city as a debt and charge against the city to be paid by general taxation upon all the property subject to taxation within the said City of Medford.

(c) In addition to all warrants and bonds authorized to be issued by sections 72 and 72a of this charter, the City of Medford shall have power and authority to issue and sell its general obligation bonds and issue time warrants for meeting the actual cost and expense incident to the laying down or the constructing of any and all public pavement in the streets and thoroughfares of said city heretofore or hereafter laid or constructed, and for the purpose of paying and redeeming any and all bonds, warrants or other evidences of indebtedness heretofore issued by the city in the construction of any and all public pavement heretofore laid or constructed, and for the payment or refund of any and all public pavement bonds and warrants now outstanding against the said city; and for the payment and refunding of any special assessment levied and paid, or which has been paid for by private subscription, and such pavement has been accepted by the city, by any person, firm, or corporation on account of the laying or construction of any such public pavement, provided such pavement abuts on property subject to general taxation.

(d) Upon the adoption of this amendment and the passing and adoption by the qualified voters of the City of Medford, of an ordinance providing for the issuance of bonds and time warrants for the payment of public pavement heretofore or hereafter constructed, and for the refunding of outstanding bonds or warrants issued by the city for such purposes, and for the repayment of any and all special assessments levied and paid on said account, the City Council shall proceed to issue general obligation bonds and time warrants of the City of Medford, Oregon, and sell the whole issue or any part thereof of the bonds at public or private sale to the highest responsible bidder or bidders at or above par, and the warrants shall be issued to all property owners entitled thereto for the amount of the special assessments paid by them or their grantors for paving.

The City Council is authorized to incur and pay reasonable expenses for the sale of said issue of bonds and warrants and to pay the cost of making said refunds and redemptions, and out of the moneys derived from the sale of said bonds, the City Council shall pay, discharge and cancel all bonds and evidences of indebtedness outstanding against the said City of Medford on account of any of the pavement mentioned in paragraph (b) of this section. After the cancellation and discharge of all of the aforesaid indebtedness, time warrants shall be issued to all property owners entitled thereto, who have heretofore paid into the city treasury, by themselves or their grantors, for such sum or sums as may have been from time to time paid by them or their grantors on account of the construction or assessment of said pavement, together with those who have paid by private subscription for any such public pavement; provided, however, that such special assessments were levied or such private subscription were made to pay for the actual cost of pavement construction, abutting on property subject to general taxation. (e) For the purpose of securing and paying off the bonds and time warrants authorized by this section, the City Council is hereby authorized and directed to make an annual tax levy upon the taxable property within the corporate limits of the said city, a sufficient millage to meet the annual installments of principal and interest on the bonds and time warrants authorized by this section, which levy shall be in addition to and free from the limitation of levy or indebtedness provided by said City Charter. (f) The City Council shall have full power and authority to provide for the method of proving claims for refunding out of the sale of the bonds and warrants, and for ascertaining and declaring to whom refunds shall be paid hereunder and the amount thereof; subject, however, to review by any court of competent jurisdiction, and said council is prohibited from making any refunds or payments either in cash or in time warrants under this amendment except upon verified claims against the city for money paid for bonds for actual cost of paving and assessments paid duly made and presented. (g) Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to authorize any refund of bonds by payment or refunding of assessment by warrants

for the construction of any private pavement either upon private property or in any of the public streets, alleys or other public places of the City of Medford, or to authorize any refund or payment for the construction of any pavement whatsoever other than is defined in paragraph (c) of this section. The following is the form in which the foregoing measure will appear upon the ballot: Annual City Election, January 9th, 1917. Mark a cross (x) between number and answer voted for. Submitted by Initiative Petition of legal voters of the City of Medford. Charter Amendment, vote "yes," or "no."

Ballot Title. "An act to amend the Charter of the City of Medford, Oregon, by adding thereto to Section 140, known as 'The Medynski Plan,' permitting the council to construct pavement under a special tax levy; creating a pavement fund for the construction and maintenance of such pavement; declaring all public pavement assessed heretofore by the city in the construction of any and all public pavement heretofore laid or constructed, and for the payment or refund of any and all public pavement bonds and warrants now outstanding against the said city; and for the payment and refunding of any special assessment levied and paid, or which has been paid for by private subscription, and such pavement has been accepted by the city, by any person, firm, or corporation on account of the laying or construction of any such public pavement, provided such pavement abuts on property subject to general taxation."

2. An ordinance to amend and supplement ordinances numbered 186, 222, 326, 366, 388, 399, 402, 418, 421, 521, 531, 532, 554, 566, 564, 565, 582, 602, 618, 639, 703, 704, 723, 768, 770, 787, 792, and 823, passed by the City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon, at various times between the 29th day of March, 1909, and the 1st day of December, 1914, authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds and the issuance and disbursement of time warrants to pay for the actual cost of pavement construction in said city, by defining the public pavement authorized to be paid for out of said bond and time warrant issues, and to include all public pavement heretofore constructed in said city; to provide for refunding bonds and time warrants to pay for said pavement, to fix the limit of the said issue and sale of the bonds and issue; to require interest to be paid semi-annually and annually and to authorize a limited millage tax for paying the principal and interest of said bonds and time warrants; to provide for the details of making the refunds of assessments and payments of outstanding indebtedness and to provide for cancellation of pavement liens, and to authorize the City Council to require proof of claims for reimbursement and the method of paying such claims.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MEDFORD DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That ordinances numbered 186, 222, 326, 366, 388, 399, 402, 418, 421, 521, 531, 532, 554, 566, 564, 565, 582, 602, 618, 639, 703, 704, 723, 768, 770, 787, 792, and 823, passed and adopted by the City Council on the following dates, respectively: March 29th, 1909, September 14th, 1909, May 13th, 1910, August 3rd, 1910, September 21st, 1910, October 20th, 1910, November 3rd, 1910, November 18th, 1910, December 7th, 1910, June 24th, 1911, July 26th, 1911, July 26th, 1911, August 16th, 1911, October 5th, 1911, September 6th, 1911, September 6th, 1911, September 21st, 1911, October 13th, 1911, November 22nd, 1911, August 28th, 1912, September 3rd, 1912, September 3rd, 1912, January 13th, 1913, August 5th, 1913, August 5th, 1913, November 18th, 1913, January 6th, 1914, and December 1st, 1914, are hereby amended and supplemented as follows: Section 2. For the purpose of paying the indebtedness heretofore incurred in the laying and construction of public pavement in the streets and thoroughfares of the city of Medford, laid and constructed under city contracts at the expense of the abutting property and by special assessments and such other public pavement as may have been heretofore constructed by special assessment against the abutting property under special assessments by the City Council, or such as have been paid for by private subscription, and have been accepted by the city, the laying and construction of which is by the people of the City of Medford, Oregon, contracted and ratified and the actual cost thereof, assessed by the City of Medford is hereby authorized to be paid off and canceled all liens against private property, incurred by the construction of said public pavement, and of refunding to the property owners with time warrants the accounts of the assessments which have been paid by them or their grantors toward the construction of any said pavement abutting on property subject to general taxation, there shall be issued general obligation bonds and time warrants of the City of Medford, Oregon, aggregating the sum of nine hundred and thirty thousand (\$925,000.00) dollars. Bonds shall be issued

for the sum of five hundred and sixty thousand (\$560,000.00) dollars, running from five (5) to twenty (20) years, beginning with the sixth year, one fifteenth of said bond issue shall be paid annually. Said bond issue shall bear interest at the rate of five (5) per cent per annum payable semi-annually and shall be dated January 1st, 1917, and time warrants for three hundred and seventy thousand (\$370,000.00) dollars to be redeemed in twenty (20) years one-twentieth each year, and shall bear interest at five (5) per cent payable annually, and shall be dated January 1st, A. D. 1917.

Section 3. The bonds issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall be paid in gold coin of the United States of America and may be issued in denominations of not less than fifty (\$50) dollars or more than one thousand (\$1000) dollars, and the warrants issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall be paid in like manner or by applying same as payment for millage tax levied by the city to pay for interest and redemption of warrants. And the bonds shall be sold and warrants disbursed according to the method prescribed by paragraph (d) of Section 140 of the Charter of the City of Medford, passed and adopted at the election held on the day of the submission of this ordinance to the legal voters of the said City of Medford.

Section 4. The City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon, is hereby empowered and directed to levy a millage tax ever and above the tax limitation of Section 65 of the said City Charter in addition to the amount necessary each and every year for the maintenance and operation of the several departments of the city government, at the time provided by the Charter of the City of Medford for fixing the annual tax levy of said city, as an additional levy each and every year for the first five years from and after the issue date of said bonds and time warrants sufficient to pay the semi-annual and annual accrued interest thereon and one-twentieth of the issue of warrants, and an additional levy each and every year from and after the fifth year of the issue thereof, sufficient to pay one fifteenth of the principal of said bonds and also one-twentieth of the issue of warrants and the semi-annual and annual accrued interest thereon, and this shall be collected by tax in lieu of special levy as herein provided, and paid on the principal and semi-annual and annual interest of said bonds and warrants during each and every year until the full amount thereof is fully paid and satisfied.

Section 5. That out of the moneys derived from the sale of said bonds, there shall, first, be paid off, discharged and cancelled, according to the terms thereof, all bonds and evidences of indebtedness and liens heretofore created by virtue of special levies assessed against private property and each and all persons for the actual cost of the laying and construction of any of said pavement within said city, provided for by pavement assessment ordinances of said city Nos. from 159 to 829 inclusive, passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon, and thereafter all of the private property affected by the laying or construction of any said pavement, and also any other public pavement paid or constructed at the expense of the abutting property and assessed as other public pavement herein specially enumerated have been assessed, shall be free from any and all special liens or incumbrances created by reason of the laying or construction of said pavement, and the City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed, in pursuance of this section, to enter due release and satisfaction thereof in the City Lien Docket of the City of Medford, Oregon. And, secondly, after the cancellation and discharge of all the aforesaid indebtedness, there shall be issued to all property owners entitled thereto, who have heretofore paid in to the City Treasury, by themselves or their grantors, time warrants for such actual assessments as may have been from time to time paid by them or their grantors on account of special assessments levied for the construction of any of said pavement; and third, there shall also be issued time warrants for the actual assessments paid to the owners of any property who, by themselves or their grantors, have paid by private subscription or otherwise for any pavement construction in the streets or thoroughfares of said city, and which pavement construction has been accepted by the city; the city council is prohibited from making any refund or payment under this ordinance for the actual assessments paid, except upon verified claims against the city duly made and presented, and such claims when authorized by the council, shall be paid by city time warrants as authorized in this ordinance.

Section 6. That the City Attorney of the City of Medford, Oregon, is hereby directed to prepare the form of the bonds and warrants, together with the necessary interest-bearing coupons and when so prepared and issued, the Mayor and Recorder are authorized and directed to sign the same in their official capacity, and to affix the seal of the City of Medford, Oregon, thereto. The City Council of the City of Medford, Oregon, is authorized and directed to do and perform any and all acts necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this ordinance. Section 7. Inasmuch as the credit of the city of Medford is endangered by the present paving indebtedness, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and adoption by a majority of the qualified voters voting at this election. Section 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
