Germs Get Busy When You Bake

First Lesson in College Course on Housekeeping... 'What is dust?' To answer this question Martha Van Rensselaer, head of the home economics department of Cornell university, planted 'dust seed,' raised by sweeping an ordinary room, in a kind of beef broth jelly... A third kind of plant-organism is often present in house dust... The little yeast plant, although so small and simple in structure, is endowed with many of the powers of trees and vegetables... Bacteria are carried on particles of dust, in liquids, and on the surface of fruits and vegetables... The rapidly of reproduction depends on warmth, moisture, and food supply... Molds also are micro-organisms... In no other way does the household bacteriology interest the housekeeper so much as when connected with the baking of her bread...
