

LOKAL ANZEIGER ACCUSES U. S. OF VIOLATING TREATY

BERLIN, Feb. 8.—In a prominently displayed leader the Lokal Anzeiger this afternoon charges the United States with a breach of treaty obligations in "compulsorily detaining" in America German subjects...

"The breach of diplomatic relations with the United States will probably be made again the occasion for leveling against us charges of breaking treaties and international law in order to mobilize the indignation of the whole world against our shameful acts."

"If treaties are thus trodden under foot after a breach of diplomatic relations, when President Wilson's phrases that Americans are sincere friends of the German nation are still resounding, what have we to expect if the contingency for which we must be prepared arrives and war breaks out."

AERO CLUB ASKS FOR FIFTY MILLIONS, AIRSHIPS

NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—A resolution adopted by the Aero Club of America which was sent to Washington today asks that the proposed congressional appropriation for army aerial preparedness be increased to \$50,000,000. The club estimates the cost and equipment of grounds at \$20,000,000 and the cost of 3000 planes at \$30,000,000.

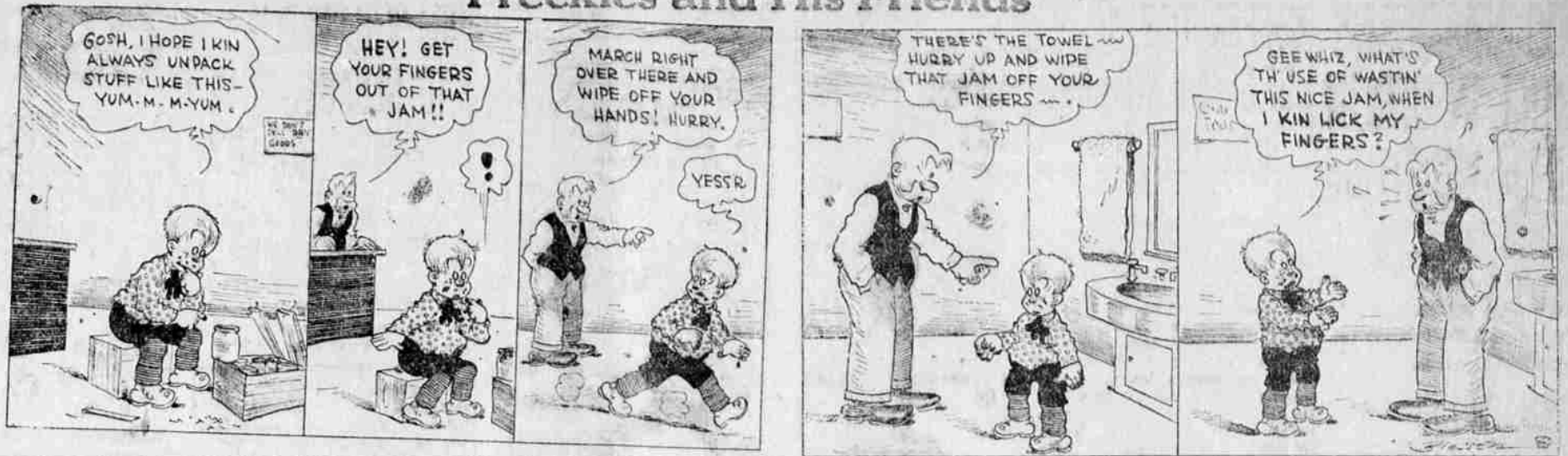
