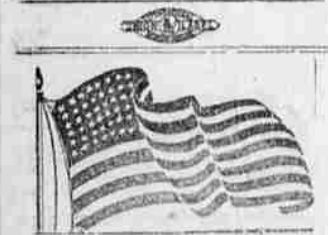

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CALIFORNIA CUTS RATES TO KLAMATH

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., Feb. 23.—According to word received today by the Klamath Commercial club from Bishop & Bahler, traffic attorneys of San Francisco, a material reduction in class freight rates to all California points on the Klamath Falls branch of the Southern Pacific, has been ordered by the California Railroad commission.

This reduction in rates has been sought repeatedly by Klamath merchants, who through the Klamath Business Men's association and Commercial club, some time ago, engaged Bishop & Bahler to prosecute the matter in California.

IN ADVANCE OF THEMSELVES.

THE national executive committee of the Socialist party has issued a proclamation against involving the United States in war, entitled "Keep Out of War's Death Dance."

The German submarine warfare does not threaten our national integrity or independence, not even our national dignity or honor. It was not aimed primarily at the United States, and would not affect the American people.

Socialist organizations have ordered the expulsion of any member that enlists or volunteers in case of war being declared and are conducting an active propaganda in favor of peace.

It will be remembered that socialists in Europe acted similarly before the war in all belligerent countries, and enunciated the same humanitarian principles, yet when war was declared and Europe plunged into the maelstrom of blood to avenge the killing of a feudal parasite the Socialists solidly supported the war, expelled those members that protested for peace, and united to furnish victims for the slaughter pens.

Does any one suppose American socialists would act differently in case Germany forced war on the United States? Defense of national rights against barbarism aggression is a far nobler cause for war than the murder of an imperial pig.

The provincialism of nationalism as well as the feudalism of royalty causes war. Internationalism is still a vision of the future, though industrial and economic progress is gradually forcing its evolution.

The Socialists, as usual, in their peace ideals are in advance of the times as well as in advance of themselves.
