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AMERICAN LINER MANCHURIA SAILS UNARMED TO EUROPE

NEW YORK, March 7.—If she can get a crew the 14,000 ton freighter, Manchuria, of the Atlantic Transport line, will sail for London today unarmored.

The crew struck yesterday for a 75 per cent war bonus. The company had already granted fifty per cent and declined to give any more on the ground that a further increase would be unfair to the men who had sailed two weeks ago on the Mongolia satisfied with a fifty per cent bonus.

The French liner, Rochambeau, reached here this morning from Bordeaux and the White Star liner, Baltic, from Liverpool with passengers and mails, got in last night.

The Adriatic from Liverpool is expected to arrive late Saturday or on Sunday morning. A wireless message received by the White Star line said that all was well with the liner.

Word of the safe arrival at Cherbourg of the American freighter City of Pueblo was also received today, making the sixth American vessel sailing for European ports to elude German submarines since February 1.

SUBMARINE LOSSES TOTAL 91,000 TONS

BERLIN, March 8.—The admiralty made the following announcement today: "Twenty-one steamships, ten sailing vessels and 16 fishing craft with an aggregate gross tonnage of 91,000 have been sunk recently by German submarines."

May your memory live forever in the heart of every true American and your courage be the guiding star for the leaders of our future generations."

Of course, these foreign born Americans whose lip protestations of loyalty to the land of their adoption are given the lie by deeds and actions favorable to the land of their birth, whose condemnation of the president of the United States is only surpassed by their praise of a foreign tyrant are excellent judges of what constitutes an American and patriot.

Harry Lane, as a recognition of his "patriotic" double cross to America, is entitled to receive an iron cross for "heroic service" to Germany and rank along with the captain of the U-Boat who sank the Lusitania, is a "guiding star for the leaders of our future generations."

SEEK HANGING ON ROOF OF SPOKANE FEDERAL BUILDING

WASHINGTON, March 8.—Treasury department officials today referred to the attorney general for decision a request from the custodian of public buildings at Spokane for authorization to use the roof of the federal building there as the location for the erection of a scaffold to put to death a federal prisoner sentenced to die March 29.

The custodian's letter stated that the prisoner, whose name was not given, had been sentenced in the federal court. The state laws of Washington prohibit capital punishment. Application was made to the commandant of a government military reservation in the state for permission to hang the prisoner there, but it was denied.

Treasury department officials are in doubt as to whether the roof of a public building could be used for that purpose, and may withhold authorization even if the attorney general's opinion is favorable.

GERMAN PLOT TO FOMENT TROUBLE IN INDIA EXPOSED

NEW YORK, March 8.—Documentary evidence purporting to show that Dr. Chakrabarty, a Hindu, and Ernest Sekuma, a German chemist, arrested here in connection with an alleged plot to foment revolution in India, had been in communication with the German foreign office, Berlin, and their plans had the approval of Dr. Alfred Zimmermann with recommendations that financial aid be given certain intriguers in this country, will be laid before the federal grand jury, it was learned from government officials when the jury resumed today its investigation into German plots.

Among the papers seized by the police in the home of Dr. Chakrabarty, it is alleged, is a document bearing the address 76 Wilhelmstrasse, Berlin, the office of the foreign secretary. In addition to these papers, others that were seized in the Wall street office of Wolf Von Igol, who accompanied Count Von Bernstorff, former German ambassador, back to Germany, will be presented to the grand jury, it was said, as evidence of a connecting link in the general plot against Great Britain.

Federal officials here declare they have no evidence thus far to indicate the German-Hindu plot was aimed at the United States.

The jury investigating the plot recently indicted Albert A. Sander and Karl Winzenberg, officials of the

central powers war film exchange in this city, for conspiracy to obtain British war secrets for the German government.
