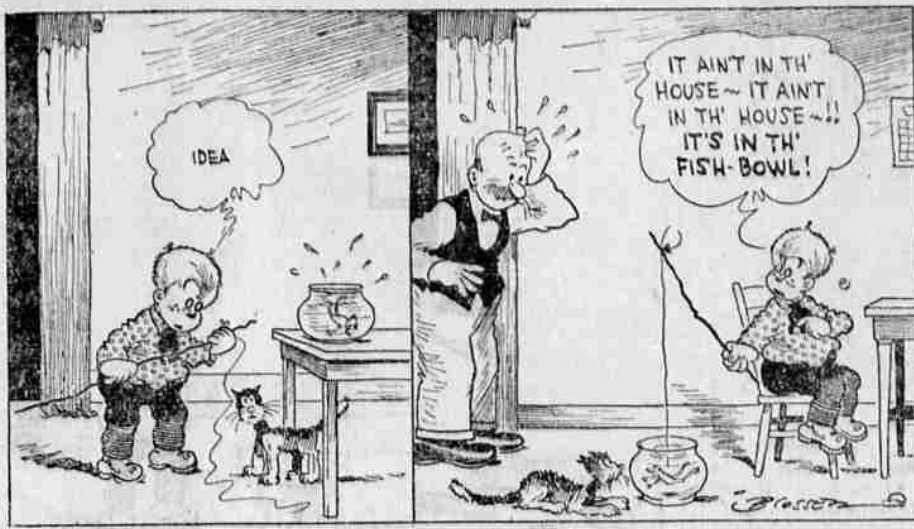

AMPUTATE LEG OF PHOENIX PIONEER

Benjamin France, a pioneer of the Rogue River valley, underwent an operation Saturday for amputation of his right leg, as a result of a peculiar accident ten days ago.
France was in his barnyard doing chores, when he slipped on a round rock, bringing a fall that broke his leg. The bone protruded and stuck in the ground. From the dirt it became infected, and complications arose, making amputation necessary to save his life. France is 64 years, lives on a farm near Phoenix, and is well known throughout the state.
