GERMAN EMBASSY GIVES MONEY IN BOMB PLOTS NEW YORK, Mar. 23.—An alleged admission that money for the establishment of a bomb factory in Hoboken, N. J., was furnished direct from officials of the German embassy at Washington was read today when the trials were begun here of six men charged with having attempted to create a reign of terror on the high seas by destroying vessels sailing from American ports with cargoes for the entente allies.

The defendants are Captain Charles von Kleist, a chemist, accused of having been engaged in the making of the bombs; Karl Schmidt, formerly chief engineer of the steamship Friedrich Der Grosse; Ernest Becker, electrician, and Frederick Karhade, George Praedel, and Wilhelm Parades, assistant engineers of the same vessel. How the police trapped the alleged plotters after bomb explosions in 1915 had destroyed vessels and cargoes worth upwards of \$4,000,000, was recited to the jury today by
