

INJUNCTION CHECKS RATE REDUCTIONS TO KLAMATH FALLS

The reduction of freight rates from San Francisco to Klamath Falls and points in southern Oregon and northern California which should have gone into effect next Tuesday will not take effect owing to a restraining order issued by Judge Frank H. Ruskin in the San Francisco Federal court.

According to the complaint filed by the Southern Pacific Company, the enforcement of the order of the commission would cause heavy financial losses.

Judge Ruskin fixed March 26 as the date upon which the commission must show cause why a permanent injunction should not be issued.

The freight rate from San Francisco to the Oregon line before any inquiry was made by the railroad commission was \$1.17 a hundred pounds.

How to Grow Irish Potatoes in Vacant Lots and City Yards.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—Many persons prompted by the high price of Irish potatoes have written to the United States department of agriculture asking how to grow them successfully in their back yards or in vacant lots in their neighborhoods.

for table use over 675 pounds of potato flesh which, under ordinary conditions, would be planted per acre.

To plant a plot 50 by 100 feet, or approximately one-fifth of an acre, to approximately one-fifth of an acre, at the same rate of seeding would call for one and two-thirds to two bushels of seed, planted in the ordinary way.

These seeds can be started indoors, provided it is possible to secure suitable soil and boxes. In such cases it may be desirable to plant the eye cuttings at once, and allow them to start into growth indoors with the idea of transplanting them into the open ground when danger of frost is past and the ground is dry enough to be cultivated.

ORDINANCE NO. 877.

AN ORDINANCE providing for the acceptance of water certificates in payment of water rent and for the issuance of water certificates on payment of water assessments and the acceptance of said water certificates in payment of water rent.

WHEREAS, the city council of the City of Medford passed a resolution on April 27th, 1916, declaring the intention of the City of Medford to issue to each property owner, who pays any assessment on account of any water main, heretofore issued, a certificate to be received in payment for water rent on said premises covered by said certificate;

Section 1. That the city treasurer of Medford, Oregon, is hereby instructed to issue to each property owner, who pays any assessment, prior to May 31, 1917, on account of any water main, heretofore issued, a certificate therefor describing the premises for which the payment is made and in the amount of the principal only.

Section 2. Said city treasurer is hereby directed to receive water certificates heretofore or hereafter issued by said city in payment of water at any time thereafter used upon said premises covered by said certificate.

Section 3. No certificate shall be issued to anyone who may pay any assessment on account of any water main after May 31st, 1917.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the reorganization of the water department of said City of Medford is now taking place and the duties of the city recorder in reference to the water department are to be performed by the city treasurer and it is for that reason necessary for the peace, health and safety of said City of Medford, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and he is in full force from and after its passage by the city council and approval by the mayor.
