9000 GERMANS CAPTURED

between Le Verguier and Hargicourt. Fighting continues along the entire battle front.

The British have seized the village of Faumpox and the neighboring defenses north and south of the Scarpe river. The Germans made a strong attack on a narrow front southeast of Ypres and reached the British support lines. They were driven from the British trenches by a counter attack. The announcement, which is timed 11:50 a. m., is as follows:

"During the night there was severe fighting at the northern end of Vimy ridge, where the enemy had retained a footing. He was ejected and an
