OUR "HORIZON"

THE PORTLAND OREGONIAN, commenting upon the appointment of Bert Anderson as appraiser by the federal farm loan board, expresses its appreciation of Jackson county democracy as follows:

Down in Jackson county there is a sudden and alarming suspicion that President Wilson is disloyal—that is to say, disloyal to the paramount welfare of the Jackson county democracy.

But when he forgets the vast deserts of the Democratic organization of Jackson county and invites Bert Anderson to be an appraiser of the Federal Farm Loan Board, at \$2100 per year, there is trouble, mighty trouble. For he it known that Bert Anderson is chairman of the Republican county committee, and Jackson county Democrats had a candidate of their own in W. N. Campbell, chairman of their committee.

Wars may come and wars may go; worlds may stagger and chaos may reign; time may end and eternity may begin; but the horizon of the Jackson county democracy continues to be bounded on the north by a political job, on the south by another political job, on the east by the promise of a job, on the west by the hope of a job.

The Oregonian has mixed its horizons. It has projected its own distorted, provincial outlook on the sky line and mistaken the mirage for Jackson county democracy, which has nothing in common with it.

When the Oregonian was acting the part of a copperhead, preaching treason for petty political purposes, striking the president from behind with its poisoned fangs at a time of international crisis, the Jackson county democracy was, as now, loyally and patriotically upholding the hands of the nation's chief executive.

It is because of this loyalty to the president that the appointment of Bert Anderson, with which the president had nothing to do, is protested and resented by Jackson county democracy. It is not because the appointee is a republican, nor because the democratic candidate had been indorsed by the state democracy, nor because of partisanship or politics, but because of Mr. Anderson's tainted political methods.

The democrats of Jackson county think it is an insult to the president to name to federal office a rabid partisan so narrow between the eyes that he has never spoken a good word for Woodrow Wilson, the mention of whose name has been at all times a signal for a flood of abusive billingsgate; they think it is an affront to reward with appointment to a non-partisan board a politician who has revived the discredited and discarded professional political methods of two decades ago and whose utilization of women in politics has made the hoped for purification of politics in iridescent dream; they think it ridiculous that the federal farm loan board should select as its Oregon representative the man who throughout the campaign denounced the federal farm loan act as a delusive fraud and an illusionary fake, of no benefit to the farmer and devised simply to swindle him out of his vote; more than all, however, they think it an outrage to decency to reward by federal office a scandal monger whose principal campaign effort was the dissemination of defamatory and libelous slander against the characters of the president of the United States and the first lady of the land.

AMERICA SHOULD HAVE HEALTHIEST ARMY IN WORLD

LONDON, April 12.—The American soldiers ought to be the healthiest soldiers in the world because he starts out backed by a medical organization that has been given all the valuable lessons learned by the British army in its three years experience in this greatest of wars.

The statement made by Sir Alfred Keogh, surgeon general of the British army, to an American Press representative, revealed for the first time the close co-operation between the medical branches of the American and British armies maintained since the early days of the war. For this fact the American people must thank Sir Alfred, the man responsible for the health of the five million British soldiers scattered over the various theaters of war, who has placed and is still doing so, all the information gained in the war at the disposal of the American army medical men.

Right now, Sir Alfred said, there are in this country four of the leading United States army medical men, who have been studying the British medical and sanitary arrangements in France and who have toured the hospitals of England and studied the Royal Army Medical corps at home. They are Surgeon Pleadwell, Colonel Bradley, Major Ford and Major Lester.

STRIVING TO UNITE COUNTY FARMERS FOR CO-OPERATION

A strong movement is being made to thoroughly organize the farmers of Jackson county by County Pathologist C. C. Cate of Medford; C. M. McAllister of Portland, who is field agent of the Union stockyards, and C. J. Hurd of Eugene, state grange organizer.

Messrs Hurd and McAllister, who have been working along this line in the county with Mr. Cate for the past week, returned to their homes yesterday. They will return on April 22nd to resume their missionary efforts. The goal being strived at is to closely band Jackson county agriculturists together in order to encourage community shipments of livestock, foster co-operation in buying and selling, have uniform standardizing of crops and uniform grading of the same, and to solve community problems in general.

As a result of the recent efforts of Messrs. Hurd, McAllister and Cate a grange of twenty-six members was organized and installed in the Valley View district near Talent last Tuesday night, and the Bellevue district south of Ashland was partially organized. This grange will be installed on April 23. Many agriculturists in the Central Point district have been lined up for a grange organization, and work has also been done towards establishing a grange at Eagle Point. A grange for the Willow Springs district is planned. It is expected that the present Agate district grange, which is not very strong, will be absorbed by the proposed new Central Point grange. The Rogue river district has a fairly strong grange.

When five strong granges have been installed it is planned to consolidate them into a county central or Pomona grange, which would be in
