THE SELECTIVE DRAFT.

THE army draft bill passed by congress and approved by the president provides for the registration for military duty of all males between the ages of 21 and 30, inclusive, that is including those in their 31st year.

About 11,000,000 citizens will be registered, of whom 500,000 will be called out for training in September as the first unit of the new army. The selections will be made by drawings, a lottery wheel being used to insure impartiality.

Numerous exemptions to the draft law are provided, as follows:

- 1. The officers, legislative, executive, judicial, of the United States and the several states and territories. 2. Duly ordained ministers of religion and those preparing for the ministry in theological and divinity schools.

No exemption or exclusion shall continue when a cause therefor no longer exists. Notwithstanding exemptions above enumerated, each state is required to supply its quota in the proportion that its population bears to the total population.

The president is empowered to make rules and regulations to carry out the terms and provisions and provide for issuance of certificates of exemption, and for a system to exclude and discharge individuals from the selective draft.

All persons of the required age must register, whether citizens or not. Aliens are not subject to draft, but the government desires a record of them.

COMPANY SEVEN WANTS 35 MORE MEN FOR SERVICE

In striking contrast to the dilly-dallying and bickerings of congress, the prompt action of the war department stands out in marked comparison in the manner in which orders began flying out over the wires in a few minutes after the president had signed the army conscription measure.

As the conscription provisions of the army bill are to be carried into effect on June 5, enlistments in the national guard organizations will be greatly stimulated. For many reasons enlistment in a national guard organization is to be desired owing to its probability of advancement and receiving commissions in the army to be conscripted.

Captain Vance states that about 35 enlistments can be received in the 7th company before the maximum of 150 is reached, and it is expected that this number will apply for a place in the company within the next few days.

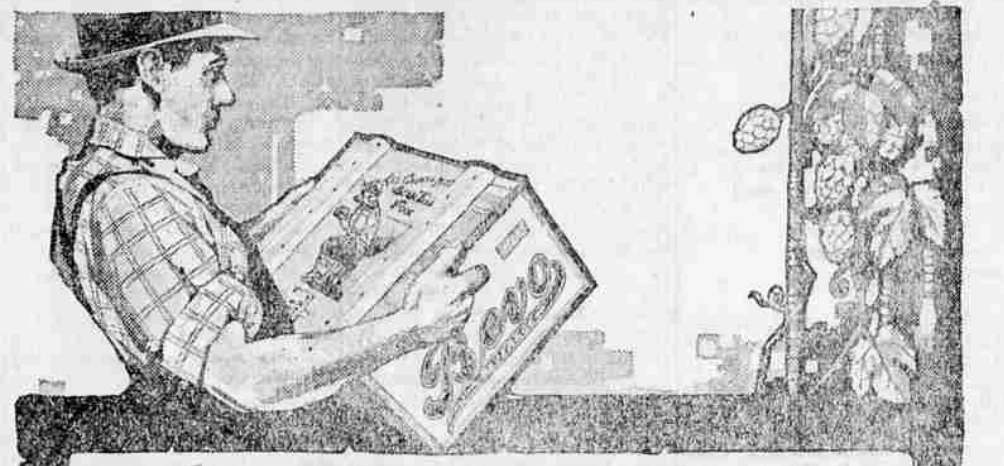

ADLER DECLARES KILLED PREMIER TO PROCURE JUSTICE

AMSTERDAM, May 12.—Dr. Fredrick Adler, newspaper editor and radical socialist, who last October shot and killed the Austrian premier, Count Karl Stierckh, according to dispatches from Vienna reporting his trial, pleaded in defense that he was guilty in the same way that any official was guilty who in war time killed or ordered the death of another man.

After the rupture of diplomatic relations with Serbia but before the actual declaration of war with that country, Dr. Adler stated, Premier Viktor von Koehenburger, had suspended justice and by refusing to assemble parliament the premier had escaped indictment. "Therefore," continued the prisoner, "I decided to call him to account and fight him with the weapons he himself had chosen. There was no other way, for if the law is violated, it is not only right but the duty of every citizen to procure justice for himself."

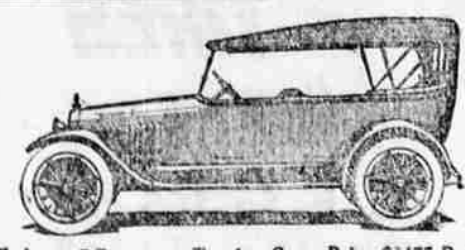

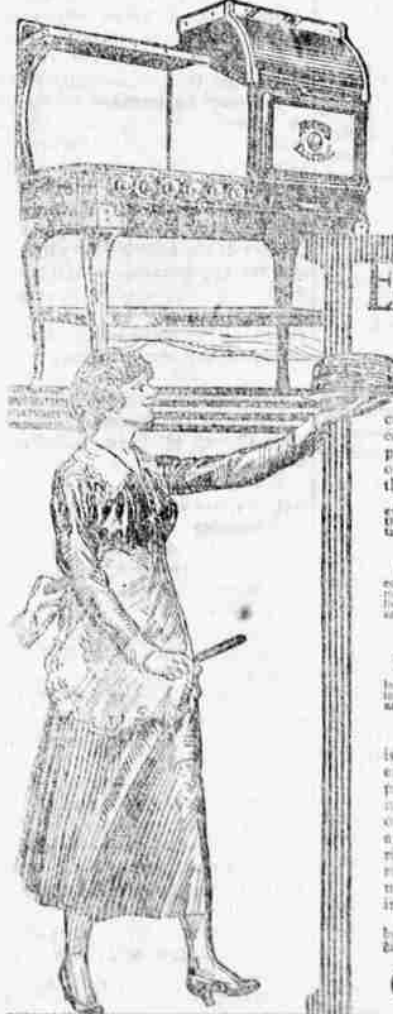
