

### WOMAN SUSTAINS BROKEN ARM IN FATAL JOY RIDE

It developed Thursday that two Grants Pass women were in the car Tuesday night in which Joseph R. Smith and James T. White were joy riding from Grants Pass to Medford, and which was overturned at a sharp turn near the old Myers place a mile northwest of Central Point, killing Smith.

Mrs. George Radford suffered a broken arm and bruises, but the other woman in the car, Mrs. C. H. Eismann, escaped with minor hurts as did White, who is the Grants Pass manager of the Oregon Gas and Electric company. Efforts made to keep secret the presence of the women in the car were unavailing. It is claimed that the party was enroute to Medford to get some fishing tackle here which belonged to White and that they intended to make a quick trip and get back to Grants Pass by midnight. Smith, who was about 40 years old, was driving the car.

No funeral services will be held over Smith's body either in Medford or Grants Pass, and the body will be shipped to Chicago, the dead man's former home, late tonight. The body is at Peil's undertaking parlors where friends can view it up to 6 o'clock this evening when the casket will be closed.

Smith had resided at Grants Pass for about a year past and was interested in mining ventures and had mining interests in the Preston peak district and was manager of the Del Norte county Claimholders association and secretary of the Tri-Metals Mining company. He had no relatives living in this part of the country, but rumor says that he was engaged to a prominent Medford girl, and that the date of the wedding had been set for an early date.

### MILITIA PROBES GUARD'S INJURY

There were no new developments in the mysterious happening of late Tuesday afternoon when Private Adam Garren of Company 1 was thrown from the bridge over Graves Creek near Leland which he was guarding, by an unknown man whom he had halted. Captain Todd was busy Thursday at Leland and Graves Creek investigating the affair.

The condition of Garren, both of whose legs were broken by the fall and who possibly suffered internal injuries, was much improved at the Sacred Heart hospital Thursday. While his mind has cleared up greatly from the effects of the shock of injuries and the morphine later administered, he was forbidden by Captain Todd to discuss the encounter on the bridge even with hospital attendants.

### FOOD LEGISLATION BEFORE CONGRESS

WASHINGTON, May 24.—Food legislation was before both houses of congress today. The senate had under consideration the administration bill to increase the production of food and expected to discuss it continuously until passage. The house took up the second administration measure providing for the creation of a food administrator, prevention of hoarding and price fixing.

Herbert C. Hoover, who has been chosen by President Wilson as food administrator under the pending legislation was installed in his new offices here today and soon will name assistants who are expected to work without pay.

### 7TH COMPANY MEN MUST ALL REGISTER

The members of Company 7 will have to register on army draft day the same as civilians. Captain A. J. Vance has issued the following order explaining this registration to his men:

"In order that there may be no misunderstanding in regard to military registration under the terms of the law just passed, the information is sent all members of the Seventh company that if you are between the ages of 21 to 30, both inclusive, you must present yourself for registration on June 5, 1917.

"The only exception applicable to members of the national guard is where muster into the federal service has been effected which in the case of Seventh company has not been done.

"Inasmuch as it has been indicated that all coast artillery troops not now in the federal service will be called to the colors on July 15, and those called under the selective draft system will not be called until September, the requirement that members of the national guard must register in no way interferes with their status as soldiers."
