MOVIES TO SHOW INCUBATING CHICKS AT POST OFFICE

More fame is soon to be thrust upon Medford through the United States, and the benevolent looking features of William J. Warner, assistant postmaster, will become familiar to the people of the country. That's why he has been sticking up lately and every few minutes polishes his eye glasses and combs his few stray locks of hair every few minutes.

When Warner conceived the idea of placing electric incubators in the basement of the federal building for the purpose of hatching in them, free of charge, 5000 eggs brought in by residents of Medford and vicinity as a war food preparedness measure, he little knew that he was putting Medford and incidentally himself on the moving picture map of the country.

That's just what happened. Now the moving picture concerns are not only after Warner's map, but want to film all the movements in connection with the hatching of the eggs into chicks. The local representative in this territory of one of the well-known moving picture news feature concerns will begin next week to film all stages of the incubator work in the federal building, including the daily turning of the eggs by ladies of the Greater Medford club.

The Medford incubator-food preparedness idea has attracted much attention throughout the country and many inquiries have come from various sections to Mr. Warner asking for details. Today he received several such letters from Michigan and Wisconsin points.

YOUNG WOMAN HEROINE OF FIRE

A PROPHECY COMING TRUE.

"THE republic, which is not yet ripe, but which in a century will embrace the whole of Europe, signifies that society is its own sovereign. It protects itself by means of its citizen-soldiers; judges itself by jury; administers its own affairs, by local government; rules itself by popular representation. The four limbs of monarchy—the standing army, the courts, the bureaucracy, the peerage—are for the republic only four troublesome excrescences which are withering up and will soon die."

These prophetic words were written in 1830 by the great French novelist, Victor Hugo. At that time the reaction from Napoleonic times had set in strong in Europe. Everywhere the kings were supreme and the people prostrate.

Hugo's own France was to have king after king until the war of 1870 drove the whole brood out. Europe is not yet given over to republican government, but Hugo's century still has 13 years to go and the present war between democracy and autocracy may hasten the blood-stained march of human liberty.

Just see what has happened since Hugo wrote: France is a republic. It has been a stable one for 47 years. England is now a constitutional monarchy in which the people have as many liberties as in a republic. In fact the monarch is a mere gilded figure-head. The new Italy has arisen from the cementing of the various little Italian states. Although it has a king, parliament, elected by the people, rules. Norway has broken away from Sweden and for a time it was touch and go whether the country would declare for a republic or for the limited kingdom which it finally adopted. Portugal some six years ago cast out kings and has been a republic ever since. Only the other day Russia revolted.

Viewed from this standpoint the most backward countries in Europe are the central powers—Germany, Austro-Hungary, Bulgaria and Turkey. In each of these the monarch is superior to the so-called representative bodies and the latter have little or no voice in the election of the responsible ministers, these being under the orders of the crown only.

The defeat of the central powers, therefore, will be as much for their own good as for that of the rest of the world. If American arms can help topple over the kingly cast in the enemy countries, if our might can help bring democracy into its own all over Europe, the date of our entrance into the world-war will be the most important in the annals of liberty.

DAILY STAGE TO BE OPERATED TO CRATER LAKE PARK

When the Crater Lake season opens in July a regular daily stage service will be operated between Medford and the lake, and the passengers will be taken back and forth in new 12-passenger national park motor busses instead of in the large automobiles that have been in use in past years.

"We are anticipating a big season at the lake this summer," said Mr. Parkhurst, "and do not think that the war will have any material effect on travel from the outside of the state. This belief is based on the many inquiries we have been receiving from all over the country about the lake season."

"I have just received a letter from H. E. Memyer, assistant supervisor of Crater Lake park, stating that there is three feet of snow at the saw mill 13 miles from the lake, six feet of snow at the park line or entrance, and ten feet of snow at the headquarters. He also said that so far there had only been three pleasant days at the lake this spring, but that if warm weather comes the snow will melt rapidly enabling the season to open up about July 1."

JUNIOR THRIFT CLUBS IN SCHOOL TO BE CONTINUED

The Junior Thrift organization of the public schools which proved so successful last summer will be continued the present summer. Superintendent Hillis announced today. The school authorities are urging parents of the pupils to co-operate and encourage the movement whose double purpose is to bring out and develop the initiative in the children and encourage them to put in their vacation at useful tasks instead of passing all this time in pursuit of pleasure or in idleness.

As was the case last year, the movement is to culminate in the fall in a public classified exhibition of the things that have been accomplished by the pupils during the vacation period, only next fall it is hoped that the exhibition will be much larger and more elaborate. It will also include statistics of earnings made by pupils at whatever they have undertaken along the line of being useful. Gardening, sewing, canning, raising poultry, raising rabbits, etc., are among the most common pursuits in the Junior Thrift organization. Each pupil can choose whatever he wants to do to be useful so as to make a showing at the exhibit in the fall.

The making of an atlas, or wagon, chopping wood, caring of yards and lawns, or creating or making anything useful all counts in the organization and at the exhibit.
