BRITAIN TO RELEASE IRISH PRISONERS

LONDON, June 15.—It was announced in the house of commons this afternoon that the government had decided to release all the prisoners taken in the Irish rebellion of Easter Sunday, a year ago.

In making the announcement Andrew Bonar Law, government spokesman in the house of commons, said that all the Irish prisoners would be released without reservation.

Bay City Short Half Million.
SAN FRANCISCO, June 15.—San Francisco was short \$483,300 of its quota of \$1,000,000 for the liberty loan at 6 o'clock tonight, according to figures made public by the liberty loan committee for the Twelfth federal reserve district. A. C. Kalns, governor of the reserve bank, said: "There is no question but that San Francisco will meet its allotment and may possibly considerably exceed it."

Air Raid on London Kills 104.
LONDON, June 15.—Sir George Cave, home secretary, announced in the house of commons that the latest reports of the casualties in Wednesday's air raid showed that 104 persons had been killed and 154 seriously and 249 slightly injured. Altogether, he said, 120 children were killed or injured.

The success of this loan is a genuine triumph for democracy. It is an unmistakable expression of America's determination to carry this war for the protection of American rights and the re-establishment of peace and liberty throughout the world to a swift and successful conclusion.

"I am deeply grateful to the bankers, the business, the women of America, the patriotic organizations and the people generally, without whose cordial co-operation and enthusiastic support success could not have been won. It has been an inspiring campaign and it has had a glorious finish."

Former Senator W. A. Clark of Montana, telegraphed a subscription of \$1,000,000 to the committee today.

U. S. WARSHIPS WELCOMED TO URUGUAY PORTS

MONTEVIDEO, June 15.—The senate decided today that if American warships visit Uruguan ports they will be interned as non-belligerents.

Altho Uruguay decreed its neutrality in the war between the United States and Germany she expressed sympathy with the United States. Warships related as belligerents would be permitted to remain in port only 24 hours and would be limited as to the supplies which they might take on.

BRITISH CAPTURES TOTAL FOR WAR OVER 100,000

LONDON, June 15.—More than 100,000 prisoners have been taken by the British during the war. James Ian McPherson, parliamentary secretary to the war office, announced in the house of commons today. Up to the end of last May, 76,067 prisoners were taken on the western front to which must be added at least 8000 for the month of June. In Mesopotamia 10,900 prisoners have been taken since July, 1916, is approximately 8739.

On the western front the British armies have captured 474 guns since July 1, 1916. In Mesopotamia 132 guns have been taken since the beginning of the war, exclusive of those lost at Kut-el Amara and subsequently recaptured. In Egypt eighteen guns have been taken.

ITALIAN MISSION VISITS MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE

MEMPHIS, Tenn., June 15.—The Italian mission arrived here today from New Orleans. The visitors were met by a citizens' committee, headed by Mayor Ashcroft.

BRITISH MERCHANTMAN CRUISER AVENGER SUNK

LONDON, June 15.—The British armed merchantman cruiser Avenger was torpedoed and sunk in the North sea on Wednesday night. All but one were saved.
