M. for the purpose of voting upon and determining whether or not the Talent Irrigation District shall issue bonds in the sum of six hundred thousand (\$600,000) dollars for the purpose, necessary or convenient, of carrying out the provisions of a certain act passed by the general assembly of the state of Oregon, of 1917, and known as House Bill number 1158, being chapter 367, of the General Laws of Oregon, 1917.

The polling place for said election shall be in the Garage, on the ranch owned by the Talent Orchard Co., and located on the N. E. 1/4 of S. E. 1/4 of section 22 (Twp. 38S, R. 12E) of the Williams Merion, and being within the boundaries of the Talent Irrigation District, Jackson County, Oregon.

The electors of said Talent Irrigation District are hereby required to cast ballots at said election which shall contain the words, "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No."
