FOREST FIRE SITUATION GROWS MORE MENACING

The forest fire situation was growing worse today because of the many old fires and new ones covering a wide range of territory. More men to fight the fires are needed. Those willing to do this service can report to the Nash hotel or the Union livery stable. Efforts were made this forenoon to get more fire fighters in Ashland, Phoenix, Talent, Central Point and other towns in the county.

Sixty-five men in all are working on the fires in the Prospect district, twenty of whom were sent up today. Half of the 20 are to work under the supervision of Forest Supervisor Erickson, and the other half are helping the Jackson County Fire Patrol association force. The Woodruff Meadows fire in the Prospect district is under control but a number of smaller fires in that section need attention.

A new fire which started yesterday in the Cougar creek section along the Big Applegate river above the mouth of Steamboat creek by last night had burned over 50 acres. Five men were rushed to the scene of the fire last evening.

A bad fire exists at the head of Anderson creek, about 8 miles northwest of Talent. This fire, the smoke of which was plainly discernible from the streets of the city yesterday was under control, but in the afternoon jumped the fire lines. Thirty men were at work on the fire all last night, and it was that it would be under control by this afternoon. This fire up to last night had burned over 200 acres.

Three new fires started yesterday

in the Butte Falls section in addition to the eight that had been burning there but are under control. The forest service sent five more men last night to this district, and today the fire association sent up 10 more. The new fires in this section are small ones so far.

A very threatening fire in live timber is being fought in the Ashland mountain district about eight miles northwest of Hilt, California, in the Oregon timber territory in which the Hilt logging company is operating. The Jackson County Fire Patrol association had a number of men working on this fire last night. Today the Hilt logging company sent its entire logging crew of about fifty men to help conquer the fire, which up to last night had burned over 100 acres. At the Hilt logging company camp, about three miles distant from this fire, a spark from a donkey engine set fire yesterday morning to some cut lumber and logs. The fire spread to the company's slashings, and its entire force of employes fought the fire all day before getting control of it.
