A PACIFIC PORT, Aug. 3 .- The American mission to Russia, headed by Ellhu Root, reached here last night en route to Washington,

The mission will remain here over night and will be entertained at a sivis lunchcon tomorrow noon. The governor of the state and the mayor of the city will be among those re ceiving the mission.

Besides Mr. Root, the members of the mission are: Charles Edward Russell, writer and publicist; Cyrus H. McCormick, president of the International Harvester company; Samuel R. Barton, banker; James Duncan, vice-president of the American Federation of Labor; Charles R. Crane one of America's leading manufacturers; John R. Mott, one of the nation's most active supporters of the Young Men's Christian association; Major General Hugh L. Scott, chief of staff of the United States army, and Rear Admiral James H. Glennon.

The mission has been away from the United States since May 19. Root Is Silent,

No official statement on the work of the mission in Russia or on the report that the mission will make on its return to Washington could be obtained.

Mr. Root, acting as spokesman declared that he had nothing to say beyond the fact that the party had been hospitably received in every Russian city that they visited,

From the Russian revolution will be evolved a stable government, ac cording to Mr. Duncan. Its establishment is retarded, he shid, by the radical so-called reformers of the character of Industrial Workers of World, who have returned te Russia after having lived awhile in America. The success of the revo lution Mr. Duncan attributed to the workmen of Russia, by whom the propaganda of freedom was first rried to the peasant class at the time of the original duma, in 1905.

Russell Answers Socialists,

Charles Edward Russell declared that the task of new Russia way greatly handicapped by German influences, and the ceaseless activity of the German propagandists. Dedaring that the socialist party in America is in the hands of German propagandists, Mr. Russell made his first answer to his expulsion from that party.

"The constitution of the socialist party in the United States provided that no one could be expelled without a hearing. 1 can have no inter est in an organization that is dis-loyal."
