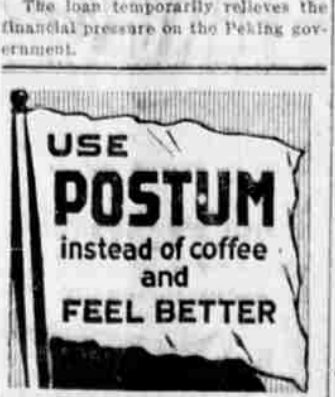
OPPOSE ANOTHER OFFER OF PEACE
