TALENT DISTRICT VOTES TUESDAY ON \$600,000 BONDS

The Talent Irrigation district will hold an election tomorrow to vote on a bond issue of \$600,000.

The engineer of the district, J. C. Dillard, has made his complete report and the district board has accepted it. The report calls for the construction of a reservoir at what is commonly known as Hyatt Prairie, about 12 miles southeast of Ashland, and for the diversion of McDonald creek through Wagner gap into the valley.

The district commonly known as Bellview, lying east of Ashland along the boulevard and comprising approximately 2500 acres has been entirely eliminated from the district by the board of directors on account of the opposition both in this territory and in the city of Ashland itself.
