Ceremony Surrounds Affair Which Is Lacking In Dramatic Interest-Baker Blindfolded Draws First Numbers-March, Crowder, Chamberiain, Militay Commitee Present.

Baker Draws First.

The drawing was held in the great conference room of the e-mate office building with Secretary Baker blidfolded taking the first gelatine capsule, with a number inclosed, from the bowl. It was number 246. Numbers 1168 and 818 were the seeond and third, respectively, and thus the drawing continued to the end.

Big blackboards for checking the record were placed against the wall at the rear of the room. The numbers were written on he board as drawn and then the board was photographed to make a permanent, incontrovertible record.

Secretary Eaker, General March, chief of staff, Provost Marshal General Crowder, Chairman Chamberlain and members of the senate military commite and members of the house military committe, stood about the table as the first numbers were drawn. Chembertain Draws Second

After Secretary Baker had taken out the first capsule, Senators Chamberiain and Warren, Representatives Dent and Kahn. Generals March, Crowder, Coloneis Charles B. Warren and J. S. Easly-Smith and Major H. C. Cramer, in order, stepped up to draw






