New meat regulations for homes and hotels and restaurants have just been announced by County Food Administrator Folger as follows: The food administration requests all hotels and restaurants not to place on the menus or serve boiled beef more than two meals weekly and roast beef more than one meal weekly. It asks householders not under any circumstances to buy more than 1 1/4 pounds of clear beef weekly or 1 1/2 pounds including the bone, per person in the household.

TOWNLEY CLEARED OF SEDITION CHARGE

ST. PAUL, Minn., July 5.—The Minnesota supreme court held today that A. C. Townley, president of the non-partisan league, and Jos. Gilbert league organizer, did not violate any state law by circulating certain literature, which referred to the war. The men were indicted in Martin county on the charge of attempting to discourage enlistments.

The court referring to the circulation of non-partisan league resolutions, said: "These resolutions, taken as a whole, appear to be nothing more serious than a somewhat flamboyant platform upon which a certain class of citizens are solicited to join an organization whose avowed purpose is the amelioration of alleged evils of

present economic conditions. The pursuit of this object does not violate the statute in question. It is perhaps not out of place to say that the resolutions have not yet attracted the attention of the federal authorities."

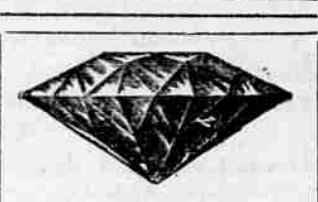
