

TWELVE CALLED IN AUGUST DRAFT JACKSON COUNTY

PORTLAND, July 19.—Captain J. E. Cullison, head of the Oregon selective service, has announced the quotas of the call for 400 men to be entrained for Camp Fremont, Cal., during the five-day period beginning August 5. This is the first call of August and Jackson county must furnish 12 men.

Authorization has been given local boards to involuntarily induct registrants of the June 5, 1918, class in case their quotas can not be filled by the remaining Class 1 men of last year's registration. Registrants of the June, 1918, class may be voluntarily inducted under this call.

Some of the local boards will find it necessary to take registrants from the June, 1918, class, as they have already exhausted their supply of Class 1 men under the 1917 registration.

Apportionments of the call issued during the first part of the week for special and limited service men and for volunteers of Classes 2, 3 and 4, experienced in sawmill and logging industries, to be sent to the spruce production division of the signal corps at Vancouver, Wash. have been announced. Volunteers will be accepted up to July 23. Involuntary inductions will be made to fill up the quotas unless enough men volunteer.

PROBE BEAN CROP OF EVANS CREEK

An investigation of what is ailing the bean crop of the Evans creek district will be begun next week by County Agricultural Agent Cate. This is the heaviest bean growing section of the county and has never before had any bean trouble. The leaves of the present crop are showing a slight yellowing and the leaves are plucked and withered. It now looks as if there would be a much shorter crop than usual.

Mr. Cate will spend four or five days on the investigation and will also try to organize the bean growers of Evans creek, the Applegate and Josephine county into an association, in the interests of community handling, better standards and uniform grading, and for obtaining better prices.

FAR EASTERN BRANCH OF COMMERCE BUREAU

WASHINGTON, July 19.—Creation of a far eastern division with C. M. Bishop of New York as chief, was announced today by the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce.

The new division is official recognition of the closer relations between America and the nations of the Orient and is the first step of the government toward developing commercial intercourse with them on a large scale.

Establishment of the new division was made possible by an appropriation which has just become available.

their spearhead midway between Soissons and Chateau Thierry. The

Americans took several towns in the course of the night.

Early this morning the Americans also made further progress.

During the night German reinforcements were coming from the region in the north, but the expected counter attack has not appeared up to an early hour this afternoon.

American troops continue to hold

the plateau southwest of Soissons where on Thursday the Germans made their first organized counter attack. This fell down, however, as soon as the American heavy artillery got into action.


This was one of the fiercest struggles in connection with the Franco-American offensive. The battle raged southwest of Soissons for some

time. It resulted in the Germans falling back finally under the rain of the heavy gunfire of the Americans.

One of the towns taken by the Americans last night was Vierzy, six miles south of Soissons. Towns to the north and south of this were also taken in the carrying out of the plan to straighten the entire line on the Soissons-Chateau-Thierry front.

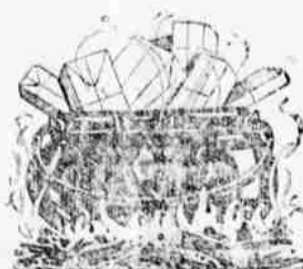
