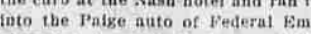
Following this accident Perrine went to Ashland with a friend after the police had notified him to appear at the chief of police's office here at 8:30 a. m. today.

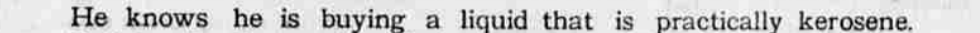
