The line of March and point of assemblage for the parade, Saturday evening, is as follows:

Liberty band—Intersection of Main and Ivy streets.

G. A. R.—Front of Hotel Medford.

Vested choir—Main street west of Hotel Medford.

Red Cross section—Main street west of Hotel Medford.

State militia (with flag of the Seventh company)—Main street north of Ivy.

Community singers—South Ivy, near park.

Mothers service flag.

Mothers, Medford section—Front of library.

Little sisters and little brothers—South of Main on Oakdale.

Men in service.

Mothers, out of town section—Front of library.

Girls Honor Guard—Main street and Oakdale.

Flag bearers.

Special notice to community singers—Please wear white with band of red hunting over right shoulder. No hats. Be at point of assemblage at 7 o'clock sharp.

As the parade will contain nothing on "wheels" automobiles will be in front of park to provide seats of honor for those mothers absolutely unable to march with the others.

GERMANS NOW ON MICHAEL LINE

AMSTERDAM, Sept. 20.—The Germans facing the Americans southwest of Metz are on the Michael line, construction of which was begun in 1916 according to a statement given out in Berlin published by the Germania.

"The plain and unvarnished truth, about the evacuation of the St. Mihiel salient is declared to be contained in the statement made public to correct erroneous impressions."

"The German troops," says the statement, "have retired to the Michael line which is the name of the position of the chord of the St. Mihiel bend. A beginning was made in 1916 to construct the Michael line, the place of which was to afford shelter to our troops should the arc of the chord become untenable in case of a serious attack. Indications that such an attack was coming became evident early in September."

HINDENBURG ALSO HANKERS FOR PEACE

LONDON, Sept. 20.—Field Marshal Von Hindenburg has issued a proclamation to the German army in the field, according to the Zeitung Ammitag of Berlin, in which the German commander in chief alludes to the recent Austrian peace offer, saying that it does not involve an interruption in the war operations.

The field marshal adds that a readiness for peace is not in contradiction with the spirit with which Germany is waging the struggle. It is the army's duty, he says, to continue the struggle while waiting to see whether the enemy is sincere and ready for peace negotiations.

WASHINGTON ENROLLS 131 PER CENT FOR ARMY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—Complete return from the draft registration in Washington state Sept. 12, announced today by the provost marshal general's office, showed 192,573 enrolled there for military service against an estimate of 146,852. This was 131 per cent of the estimate, or the highest registration so far reported by any state. Officials said today that enrollment in the nation to date was 1,915 per cent of the estimated total, 12,778,900.

SPANISH INFLUENZA SPREADS IN ARMY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—Rapid spread of Spanish influenza among soldiers in training with epidemics at Camps Devens, Mass.; Upton, N. Y.; Dix, N. J.; and Lee, Va.; is shown today in Surgeon General Gorgas' weekly health report, which says the disease may be expected to appear at other camps soon. The number of cases reported so far is not given.

There were 198 deaths at all camps during the week, compared with 95 during the preceding week.

PARENTS MUST SEND CHILDREN 9 TO 15 TO SCHOOL

"Every parent or guardian, or other person in the state of Oregon having control of or charge of any child, or children, between and including the ages of nine and 15 years of age, shall be required to send such child, or children, to the public schools for a term or period of not less or more than the number of months in the district in which such parent, guardian or other person in parental relationship may reside."

The foregoing is the section as taken from the school laws of the state of Oregon. Parents are asked to comply with the foregoing regulation, thereby avoiding any difficulty that would have to through necessity arise if the same should be violated.

Prof. Davenport, superintendent of schools, will be pleased to confer with parents at the regular office hours from 8 to 9 and from 3 to 4 as to matters pertaining to the administration of the schools. There are many problems of an administrative nature that should be taken up exclusively at these hours and not done by the telephone. In fact it will be the policy of the superintendent to consider complaints and misunderstandings of an allied nature only at the regular office hours in conference with patrons, and not to take up such matters over

the telephone. The office hours are maintained for the patrons and they are cordially invited to take advantage of the same.

BRITISH AGAIN BOMB DOCKS AT BRUGES

LONDON, Sept. 19.—British army and navy aviators in the last 48 hours have dropped 13 tons of bombs on the docks at Bruges and a German airdrome in Belgium, says an official statement from the admiralty today. In air fighting 11 German airplanes were destroyed.

ROME, Sept. 20.—The selection of a successor to Cardinal Farley of New York will be considered at the November meeting of the consistory. It is stated that owing to the important duties of the office a young and vigorous man probably will be chosen.
