Women in War Work

Information concerning the sending of Christmas parcels overseas: The war department realizing that the families of men in the service, abroad are anxious to make Christmas overseas as pleasant as possible, has decided that each man may receive a package from his family. Shipping space available will permit the sending of but one parcel to each man. To avoid duplication and to make sure that each parcel is correctly addressed, a "Christmas parcel label" is now being issued to every man abroad. Each man will mail his "label" to some relative or friend who will be entitled to send him a parcel. The relative who receives this label will apply to their Red Cross chapter and upon showing the label will receive a carton in which the parcels must be sent. Specially manufactured cartons for this purpose will be sent to each chapter from division headquarters. Application should not be made at Red Cross until a notice has been given the public that the cartons have been received.
