11 INDICTMENTS 2 NO TRUE BILLS BY GRAND JURY

The grand jury which finished its work last night brought in eleven indictments, returned two no true bills and made recommendations concerning the county officers.

Roy Sales, three indictments, one for adultery, one for contributing to the delinquency of a minor, and another for larceny of a dwelling; Mark Foster, rape; George R. Cowen and John Doe, larceny of a dwelling; Frank Parent, wanton injury to animals; Harry S. Lynch, using water lawfully denied him by the water master; Ed Wall, contributing to the delinquency of a child; Frank Marada, two indictments, one for contributing to the delinquency of a child and the other indecent exposure of person; and R. J. Miller, uttering a check with intent to defraud.

In circuit court today a number of those indicted were arraigned. Frank Parent pleaded not guilty and his bond was fixed at \$200. George R. Cowen pleaded guilty and will be sentenced Saturday. The bail of Ed Wall, altho he was not arraigned, was fixed at \$1000.

The jury recommended that the county clerk, treasurer, assessor, recorder and sheriff, and that in the short time it had to conduct this examination found that the offices had been conducted in a business-like manner and that the records were neat and apparently well kept.

The jury recommended that the county court make necessary vault changes incidental to the consolidation of the clerk's and recorder's offices next January. It also suggested that more careful attention be given the janitor work in the court house, especially in the jury room.

DIPLOMATIC DUPLICITY.

EXAMINATION of Prince Maximilian's statement elucidating German's peace offer confirms its insincerity. Customary German camouflage abounds. Professing to accept the president's terms, he avoids accepting anything but a discussion of those terms and even refuses to part with Alsace-Lorraine—an essential to peace.

Germany does not want peace on Wilson's terms and Germany does not propose to accept peace on these terms. The German army has not been crushed. Though driven out of a portion of France and Belgium, the army is still a long way from Germany, still fighting valiantly, with no sign of collapse.

The object of the peace drive is to create dissension among the allies and to strengthen German morale and get the German people's enthusiasm aroused for defending the Fatherland. There has been no democratizing of the government, no general election. The people have not been consulted in any way.

Even if the German people were in control, the situation would not be altered. It is the German people who have approved the war and who have backed up frightfulness. Not a single expression of regret has come out of Germany on account of the atrocities committed—merely the whine of whipped curs now that defeat impends.

Let us set down sternly that we are at war with the Germans, not the Junkers, not autocracy, not Prussianism, not the kaiser (spelled with a small 'k'). All that is camouflage and dangerous, because it obscures the truth. The German people is what we war with. The German people is committing the unspeakable horrors which set the world aghast.

They have violated every treaty with the United States; they have lied from start to finish and to everybody. A treaty was a scrap of paper. This week the Prussian lords have dishonored a prince who was Ambassador to England at the opening of this war because he has published the truth saying that neither France nor England wanted war, Germany brought it on; and the emperor has sustained the action.

Germany has ravished the women of Belgium, Serbia, Roumania, Poland, Armenia; Germany murdered the passengers of the Lusitania and struck a medal to celebrate that German triumph, dating it two days before the horrible occurrence; Germany has ruined cathedrals and cities in sheer wanton fury in such fashion as has not been done in all the wars waged in Europe since the days of the building of the cathedrals; Germany has poisoned wells, crucified inhabitants and soldiers, burned people in their houses, and his by system; Germany has denatured men and boys, has wantonly defaced the living and the dying and the dead.

Germany has disclosed neither decency nor honor from the day it started the war nor has a single voice in Germany to date been lifted up against the orgies of ruthlessness which turn the soul sick and which constitute the chief barbarity of history; Germany remains unblushing and unconscious of its indecency; Germany's egotism still struts like a kaiser; and to climax its horrid crimes, Germany has inflicted compulsory polygamy on the virgins of its own land.

Total, 1265.

Y. M. C. A. ENTERS SOUTH AMERICA

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 23.—South America is to be organized for Y. M. C. A. work along the same lines as the European countries. The war work council of the Young Men's Christian Association in New York has appointed Jev G. Field of the Buenos Aires Y. M. C. A. to act as secretary in South America in which capacity he will look after the entertainment of United States sailors whenever they land at any South American port.

It is proposed to have permanent organizations in all the South American ports under the direction of the Y. M. C. A. fleet secretary, which can on a moment's notice prepare themselves to entertain any number of sailors who may be sent ashore on leave.

One night recently when an American cruiser was in the port of Buenos Aires, the Y. M. C. A. arranged for the entertainment of 120 sailors in the homes of American and English families. As Buenos Aires has the only Y. M. C. A. building in South America large enough to look after a large number of sailors, the first work of the Y. M.

RUSSIAN AMAZON CALLS ON RUSSIANS TO OUST GERMANS

ARCHANGEL, Sept. 22.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) Maria Butchkareff, organizer of the famous Russian women's battalion, is here aiding the organization of a Russo-Allied army. She has caused the following proclamation to be posted in village squares and in the country churches:

"I am a Russian peasant and a soldier. At the request of the soldiers and peasants I went to America and Great Britain in order to request these countries for military help for Russia. The allies understand our own misfortune and I return with the allied armies which came only for the purpose of helping to cause out our deadly enemies, the Germans and not to interfere with our internal affairs. After the war is over the allied troops will leave Russian soil.

"I, on my own part, request all loyal free sons of Russia, without reference to party to come together, setting aside the allied forces, who, under the Russian flag have come to free Russia from the German yoke and in order to help the new free Russian army with all forces, including Russian, to beat the enemy. Soldiers and peasants: Remember that only a full clean sweep of the Germans from our soil can give you free Russia as you long for."
