25,000 CALLED TO COLORS IN CALIFORNIA

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Oct. 25.—In response to notices by the enrollment in November and December of 25,000 class and California draft registrants were received today by Governor William D. Stephens from Provost Marshal General Crowder. This is 12 per cent of the total number of class one men registered in California September 12.

SUPPORTING THE PRESIDENT.

THE president is right in asking the election of a democratic congress to support his administration and enact his policies, right in seeking unity rather than division in government affairs at a time of national crisis.

Every vital measure of the war has originated with the president. Congress has not demonstrated much capacity or resource, and has enacted his program, frequently in fardly fashion, because popular opinion overwhelmingly supported the president and condemned the peanut politics played by the politicians for personal or partisan advantage.

Will H. Hays, who made such a success in colonizing Indiana with negro voters from the south for the republicans in 1916 that they elected him national chairman, has been busy trying to elect a republican congress on the grounds that the republican party is a war party. So is the democratic party. So is the prohibition party. The war is not the private property of any one party, but of all.

But Mr. Hays and his politicians' constructive efforts to win the war consist in criticism of the president and of the administration—not for the things they have done, but for the manner in which they are done, and for not doing them faster.

The president has given the best reason in the world why a democratic congress should be elected—because such a congress is forced to enact his measures and support the administration, because divided control in governmental as in personal affairs, spells division and discord and because the election of a republican congress would be considered abroad as a popular repudiation of the president and his war policies.

These are reasons enough for the election of a congress that will support and assist the president in winning the war rather than in one that will hamstring him for petty political profit.

Fallen for Freedom

The following casualties are reported by the commanding general of the American expeditionary forces: Killed in action, 21; died of wounds, 11; died of accident and other causes, 3; died of disease, 20; wounded severely, 96; wounded degree undetermined, 188; wounded slightly, 169; missing in action, 13; died from airplane accident, two; prisoners, four. Total, 513.

CZECH DEPUTY GRILLS GERMANS IN PARLIAMENT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25.—The war weariness of Austria-Hungary is strikingly illustrated by an inflammatory speech just delivered in the Austrian parliament by Deputy George Stribrny, a Czech. In the face of his open defiance, the German members of the body sat silent and did not venture to "slat him out."

"You call us traitors and cowards," the deputy said. "If there is just one soul man among you, let him try to realize the feelings of the Czech soldier who was driven by force into that war which the German chancellor called upon the 'fight of Germanism against Slavdom.' Try to realize how a soldier felt who was ordered under penalty of immediate hanging to march to war against the interests of his own people, against the interests of his own country. Was this man a coward, when he listened to the other side under the fire of Austrian and German cannon, which attacked him from the rear? What man a coward who answered in words over and could then safely, well for the end of the war, but was voluntarily sent to the front again to risk his life?"

Two hundred jockies from the Great Lakes naval station and its many civilians caused a near-riot because an American eagle still adorning Vogelung's cafe, on West Madison street, Chicago, while the crowd cheered a jockey mounted a ladder and hung an American flag over the hated emblem.

"The peoples of the allied countries with whom we are associated against Germany are quite familiar with the significance of elections. They would find it very difficult to believe that the voters of the United States had chosen to support their president by electing to the congress a majority controlled by those who are not in fact in sympathy with the attitude and action of the administration.

"I need not tell you, my fellow countrymen, that I am asking your support not for my own sake or for the sake of a political party, but for the sake of the nation itself in order that its inward unity of purpose may be evident to all the world. In ordinary times, I would not feel at liberty to make such an appeal to you. In ordinary times divided councils can be endured without permanent hurt to the country, but these are not ordinary times.

"If in these critical days it is your wish to sustain me with undivided mind I beg that you will say so in a way which it will not be possible to misunderstand either here at home or among our associates on the other side of the sea. I thank you for difficulties and my hopes to you.

DIAZ STRIKES BLOW.

LONDON, Oct. 25.—The Serbians have defeated the armies of the enemy in the valley of the Great Morava river, says an official Serbian announcement. The enemy is retreating in disorder.

The French are east of the Sambre canal, two German attacks were repulsed. On the front of the Sambre river and eastward, the French this morning claimed their successes against the enemy.

TEN INCHES SNOW AT CRATER LAKE WORK IS STOPPED

All improvement work for the year at Crater Lake has been discontinued because of the winter season having set in there and Alex Sparrow, superintendent of Crater Lake, arrived in the city Wednesday to go into winter quarters here. The government engineers left October 6th, and now the only person there is H. E. Monvor, the veteran forest ranger who annually for years has spent the winter at the park headquarters. During the severe part of the coming winter, however, Mr. Monvor will be replaced at headquarters by a younger man.

Superintendent Sparrow reports that despite the fact that 10 inches of snow fell at the lake rim on October 16th, and much snow in the lake region, the roads are in perfect condition all the way to the lake. The recent heavy rains and the snow have made them splendid. He declares that despite the cold and snow this is an ideal time at Crater Lake, the atmosphere being so clear one can "see a million miles away," giving almost unbelievable charming scenic views.
