

LIBERTY LOAN SLACKERS NAMES TO BE PUBLISHED

Chairman Kidd of the Medford Liberty loan committee, has received the following letter from R. W. Smith, Liberty loan manager for Oregon, advising the publication of the names of Liberty loan slackers. The request will be complied with, after Chairman Collins of the Council of Defense has made an investigation of the slacker cases:

"The publication of the names of the slackers has received more consideration in the Fourth loan than in any of the preceding loans. The slacker evil is not nearly so great in Oregon as it is in many other states, and for this reason the Oregon state central Liberty loan committee and local committees have not given as much attention to this problem as Liberty loan committees in other states.

"However, every Liberty loan worker in Oregon knows that there are slackers and fully appreciates the necessity of adequate measures for handling such cases. Unfortunately, a few of our citizens refuse to do their part unless they are driven to it. Future Liberty loans cannot be successfully floated unless flagrant cases of slackers are punished thru adequate publicity.

"Apparently the general executive board at San Francisco is of the same opinion, and no doubt this opinion is based on a careful study of the situation in each of the western states. We are today in receipt of the following telegram, which will speak for itself:

"The following resolution adopted today: 'Resolved, that the general executive board of the Twelfth Federal Reserve districts approves the publication wherever considered necessary and where careful investigation has first been made of the names of persons, firms or corporations who, without good excuse, have failed to subscribe to the Fourth Liberty loan or have made flagrantly inadequate subscriptions.'

"Where you have cases of slackers who do not seem to be affected by the publication of their names, I would recommend that the cases be reported to this office, in order that we may enlist the assistance of the state council of defense. A public trial held under the auspices of the county and state councils of defense should produce results, and this office will be glad to assist you in securing such cooperation. While of course the publication of the names of slackers after the loan period has expired will not produce any funds for the present campaign, it will show those persons who have made sacrifices in order to subscribe the limit that the local and state Liberty loan organizations are treating them fairly and it should produce results in the fifth campaign."
