

LAUNCH CAMPAIGN FOR WAR FUNDS

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Oct. 29.—With an organization reaching down to the last home in the community, the United War Work campaign of the seven welfare organizations doing work among the American troops, the Y. M. C. A., Y. W. C. A., National Catholic War Council, which includes the Knights of Columbus, Jewish Welfare Board, War Camp Community Service, American Library Association and Salvation Army, has been launched.

The drive for funds will be held during the week of November 11. The country's quota is \$170,500,000 and the eight states in the western war department together with the Philippines, Hawaii and Alaska are to raise \$8,225,000 or 5 per cent of the total.

The quotas for the states follow: California, \$4,688,740; Oregon, \$707,250; Washington, \$1,278,250; Idaho \$426,250; Montana, \$511,500; Nevada, \$85,250; Wyoming, \$196,075; Utah, \$841,000; Hawaii, \$213,125; Alaska, \$16,050.

Western department headquarters is in the Flood building, San Francisco, with Lyman L. Pierce as western campaign manager.
