BONE DRY BILL APPARENTLY LOSES IN GOLDEN STATE

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6.—Bone dry prohibition in California, in amendment number 22, apparently was decisively defeated today when San Francisco's overwhelming vote against it came in.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 6.—California's bone dry amendment No. 22 took the lead in election interest today with the governorship and most of the other state offices reasonably well decided.

Wet votes still were in the lead today, with the returns in from 1299 complete precincts of 6191 in the state. These fairly well scattered in 28 counties showed: Yes, 53,013; no, 56,799. This majority of 3,786 against adoption was in line with returns since early last night, except for a brief time in the early morning when many incomplete returns, particularly from southern dry districts, indicated adoption.

POWER COMPANY LOSES TRANSFORMER

The California-Oregon Power Co. lost one of their \$8,000 transformers and also the transformer house at the Gold Bay plant this morning, the same having burned up about 3 a. m. They had been working on the transformer for some time and had it about ready to put into service again with the exception of drying out the oil. This was being accomplished with the aid of an electric force which was under the transformer boiling the oil. The parts of the transformer that were not being heated were hanging from the crane in the transformer house and were covered with canvas and evidently the fumes from the boiling oil were ignited by a short circuit some place in the building, causing the building to catch fire and completely burn up together with the transformer parts.

There were two other transformers of the same size in the building, but outside of the insulation being burned off of them, they were very little damaged and can be easily repaired. The building was mostly corrugated iron and the sides are standing but the interior was completely gutted.

TWO YEARS MORE FOR MAYOR GATES AND CITY COUNCIL

With no opposition, the entire city administration was elected at Tuesday's election for the ensuing two year term. The only contest was for recorder in which M. L. Alford, incumbent, defeated H. D. Howard by a vote of 337 to 191.

The vote was the lightest cast in years at a city election.
