THE OLD ORDER PASSETH

THE partnership of "Me und Gott" has been permanently dissolved. The mad monarch is a fugitive in flight—his grandiose scheme of conquest and dreams of world empire a nightmare of the past. The philosophy of "might makes right" has crumbled before the eternal law of right makes might. The unleashed forces of barbarism lie prostrate before the martial forces of civilization and autocracy humbled and crushed by democracy. The path of "glory" has led but to the grave.

The old order passeth—in travail and suffering the new is born. Ten million of lives, widespread devastation, universal suffering and sorrow is the price paid for the birth of freedom in continental Europe—for the death throes of feudalism, for freeing humanity from the chains that shackled progress and enslaved peoples. But the price has not been too great if the results within reach are achieved.

William Hohenzollern will rank in history as the last of the feudal monarchs. With him falls for all time the theory of the divine right of kings, the enthroned right of the few to exploit the many. With defeat has come the disillusionment of the German people, who intoxicated by military success, suffered from megalomania to the extent that the entire nation became tainted, slavishly followed a maniac into the abyss of scientific savagry and lost her soul.

Troublous days are ahead for the peoples of central Europe—days of turmoil, struggle and bloodshed, but in spite of them and out of them will come a new Europe—nations of free men with opportunity to work out their own salvation as they painfully toil up the spiral of progress towards the brotherhood of man.

It has been America's priceless privilege to furnish the ideals along with the men and the materials that overthrew the old order and made possible the dawn of the new day. It is also our privilege as well as duty to aid in the establishment of law and order in the demoralized countries and assist in the restoration of ruined lands and to that end our energies must be expended—and above all to see that a permanent peace based upon justice to all is established.

Philosophers have defined unselfish service as the source of happiness—and our future happiness as a nation depends upon the service we render the world in the trying period of reconstruction now at hand.

Kaiser Writes to Clown Prince

The following letter was written by a Scitola girl in reply to the recent letter published in a Kansas paper, written by Crown Prince Willie to his papa, the Kaiser: Somewhere in Germany, Here, There and Everywhere, Night and Day All the Time—Dear Son Willie: Received your very pleasing (?) letter dated "All the time."

Now, son, I am very sorry dat dem Americans are so ignorant and unmannerly. We didn't built this great war machine of ours to conquer such ignorant people with. I thought the world was better civilized or I would never haf started such a war. I never haf been in America but I supposed dat dey were vel educated to know dat I and Gott and Germany were going to rule the whole world. It may be dat if dey don't become better educated quick at once dat we will haf to give up this war for conquest and go to fighting for defense. Yes, Willie, I haf just about already decided this. There's no use trying to conquer a people that are too ignorant to know dat we can whip dem.

SOVIET REPUBLIC RULES BAVARIA DYNASTY OUSTED

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 10.—The proclamation issued at Munich in behalf of the council of workers, soldiers and peasants, which constituted itself into a diet, announcing a republic has been formed in Bavaria, declared that "the great socialist republic of Bavaria has the strength to realize a peace for Germany, preserving that country from the worst." The proclamation, after promising a constituent assembly to be elected by all adult men and women, says that Bavaria will make Germany ready for a league of nations. It then continues: "The present revolution is needed to complete the self-government of the people before enemy armies stream across our country or before troops should, after the armistice, bring about chaos."

MEDFORD NOISILY WELCOMES NEWS OF WARS END

Altho it was midnight when the glad news of the signing of the armistice reached Medford within fifteen minutes the streets were crowded with people celebrating the glad news and within half an hour over a thousand people were on deck with every known kind of noise maker.

The celebration started with the blowing of the fire whistle and was soon followed by the ringing of the fire bell and the firing of many guns of all calibres. It sounded something like a battle on a small scale. The streets were crowded with automobiles all blowing horns and klaxons, some had tin cans and large sheets of tin tied on behind and when making about thirty miles an hour these contrivances made a much noise that the "natives" for miles around were wakened out of a sound peaceful sleep.

The first S. P. train to arrive on the scene got busy and sat on the whistle cord until the steam pressure was so low that there was no more sound and the crew had to steam up before the train could leave town. The engine crew kept the good work up all the way to Phoenix, waking up farmers all along the line.

People on the streets fairly went mad. Men, women and children all joined in and the number of sore throats this morning number well into the hundreds. Main street is covered with shot gun wads and in front of the Commercial Club is what is left of a cap that was thrown into the air and shot to pieces.

About 2 a. m. a live bunch from Jacksonville headed by Louis Ulrich and Peter Fische arrived on the scene and proceeded to show some of the real Jacksonville spirit that has been so much in evidence during the many war drives. This bunch immediately blocked Main street with cars and started a war dance up and down the street, making everyone join in and it was long after 3 o'clock before the excitement began to die down.

The many cars thoroughly covered the town and it is safe bet that none of the residents slept thru the celebration. The fire truck made the rounds with guns blazing and the town wide open. The glad news that hostilities had ceased brought everyone out and the noise and celebrating was still going on this morning with machine loads of young people driving up and down the streets ringing cowbells and beating on tin pans, etc. It has been some time since there has been such a wild demonstration in our city and it is safe to say that there won't be another until our boys come marching home and then LOOK OUT!
