NATIONAL GUARD LOST 1513 OFFICERS DUE TO INEFFICIENCY

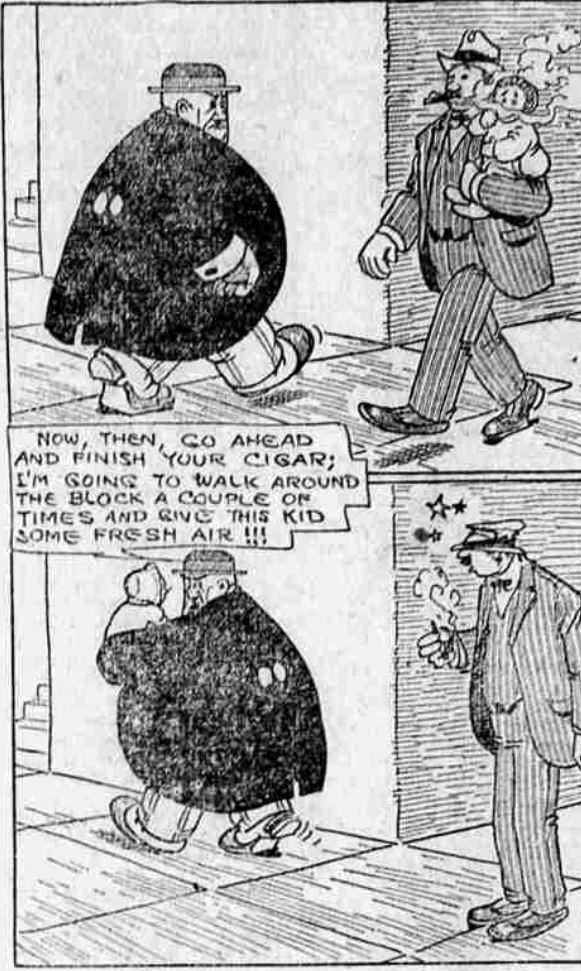
WASHINGTON, Dec. 9.—Within nine months after the national guard was drafted into federal service 1,513 of its officers had been eliminated, according to a report made public today.
