

HOUSTON RAISES GRAZING FEES NATIONAL FOREST

FORTLAND, Dec. 12.—Secretary Houston, believing that further suspension of the increase in national forest grazing fees first decided on in 1916 is no longer justified, has announced new rates to go into effect March 1, 1919, according to an announcement received from the Washington office of the forest service by District Forester George H. Cecil, Portland. Effective at the same time, he has authorized the granting of five-year grazing permits where the conditions warrant and such permits are desired by the stockmen.

RED CROSS QUOTA OF 1917 MUST BE DOUBLED IN 1918

PORTLAND, Dec. 12.—Oregon will have to secure double the number of Red Cross memberships obtained last year if it is to maintain its reputation as a state which never falls when called on. There have been no quotas established for the Red Cross membership campaign, December 18 to 23, other than that "universal membership" is desired, and that means that every adult must become a member of the Red Cross, the great humanitarian institution if its program is to be fully carried out.

GEN. DIMITRIEFF IS EXECUTED BY SOVIET

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 12.—Generals Ruski and Dimitrieff of the Russian army, have been shot by order of the local soviet at Praprogorsk, according to an official Ukrainian statement received here from Petrograd. DISCUSS EXTENSION OF ARMISTICE TERMS

PARIS, Dec. 12.—(Havas.)—Negotiations for the prolongation of the German armistice began today at Treves, Rhineland Prussia. The Matin says that the German armistice delegates have requested that the allies reinforce their troops at certain points in order to aid the German authorities in maintaining quiet. The newspaper adds that in cases where German military chiefs may urge more extended occupation in central Germany the allies will limit the sending of troops into German territories only to the necessities of occasions that may arise.

ORDINANCE NO. 962

AN ORDINANCE to protect and safeguard the health of the people of the City of Medford and prevent the further spread of Spanish Influenza. THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOETH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to be in any store, hotel lobby, office, club room, place of business or public place within the said City of Medford, or on any street, alley, sidewalk or thoroughfare within said City of Medford without wearing an influenza mask consisting of not less than three thicknesses of cotton gauze covering the nose and mouth of said person, until this ban shall be lifted by order of the board of health of the City of Medford.

That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 129 entitled "An Ordinance to establish a city board of health, to define the duties of the physician to be the health officer and to protect the public health and prevent the spread of contagious and infectious diseases in the City of Medford, Oregon, approved July 6, 1917," shall be amended so as to read as follows:
