

RESUME TRADE WITH RUSSIA AND FINLAND

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—Plans for resuming general trade with parts of Russia and Finland were disclosed today by an announcement from the war trade board that applications now will be considered for import licenses for commodities, the chief of which are platinum, various hides and skins and furs, sulphur and various kinds of seeds.

The school ban cannot be expected to accomplish all desired results if riotous gatherings are allowable in other avenues.
