The original resolution called for the appearance of the commission before a joint session of the senate and house next Monday morning. It was amended to have the commission appear next Thursday night at 8 o'clock at the public meeting of the senate and house in the hall of representatives.

LONDON, Jan. 17.—The Spanish government has published a decree suspending constitutional guarantees in the province of Barcelona according to a wireless dispatch received here from Madrid.

ENGLAND TO BUY RAILROAD SYSTEM AT PRE-WAR PRICE

LONDON, Jan. 17.—Winston Churchill, minister of munitions, who announced the government policy of nationalizing British railways, explained to the Dundee chamber of commerce the reasons for the proposed step.

Owing to the enormous debt with which the country had been burdened by the war, he said, relief measures on a big scale were required. "The three great parent factors of a country's welfare," he continued, "are land, communications and power, and the three children food, housing and manufacture. So long as the railways are in private hands they may be used for immediate profit, in the hands of the state, however, it might be wise or expedient to run

them at a loss if they develop industry, place the trader in closer contact with his market, and stimulate development.

"You cannot organize the great questions of land settlement, new industries, and the extension of production, unless the state has control of the means of transportation."

A mass of information about the railways is already available, he said, and a large part of the task of nationalization has automatically accomplished itself. "I think it highly improbable," he went on, "that action on this vital matter can be delayed until a royal commission has wandered about."

Explaining to the press a bill which the Railway Nationalization society has prepared, Emil Davies, the chairman, said it provides for the acquisition of all railway stocks and shares at their mean market price during the twelve months ending six months prior to the introduction of the bill in parliament, the purchase price to be paid in 5 per cent government stock to the railway shareholders.
