AMERICAN FOOD BEING DISTRIBUTED IN STRICKEN LANDS

PARIS, Tuesday, Feb. 4.—The American food administration today gave out a statement relative to the relief of Roumania and other countries. It says in part: "The American steamship Western Plain has arrived at a Roumanian port with seven thousand tons of American flour for the relief of the Roumanian people."

"In accordance with promises made to the Czechoslovak government the United States relief administration has delivered to it five thousand tons of flour at Trieste, which is being transported by Czechoslovak trains to Prague. There also has been placed at the disposition of the Czechoslovaks at Trieste six thousand tons of pork and ten thousand tons of flour. Additional quantities are available for them as fast as transportation can be arranged."

A NEEDED REFORM.

A MUCH needed reform is proposed in the petition presented by the women and churches of Medford to the city council asking the licensing and supervision of public dances, which have become a menace to the morals of the community. Prompt action by the council is anticipated.

As there is likelihood that the promoters of these public dances will hold them in the adjacent towns rather than submit to regulation, similar restrictions should be adopted in other valley towns. This being the age of the automobile, such a dance can be as easily staged at Eagle Point or Gold Hill as Medford and secure the same class of patronage with the resultant deterioration in morality.

There are really no features in the proposed regulations that can be reasonably objected to. They are in force, with slight modifications in Portland, Seattle and other cities and have proved beneficial. Sumptuary laws will not force people to be good—but they can remove temptation from the very young until they reach the years of discretion, and they can eliminate flagrant abuses.

GERMAN CAPITOL MOVED TO WEIMAR FOR ASSEMBLY

WEIMAR, Feb. 3.—(By the Associated Press).—The process of temporarily transferring the German seat of government from Berlin to Weimar, where the national assembly is to meet Thursday is expected to be virtually completed tomorrow when Count Brockdorff-Ransmeau, foreign secretary, will reach here. The cabinet minus its official records and other documents, managed to hold an executive session in the palace late in the afternoon. The present government considers its mandate expire with the convening of the constituent assembly and its first task will be to move the immediate appointment of a new coalition government, in the organization of which party interests will be eliminated.

MADRID, Feb. 5.—Fermín Calbeton Y. Planchon, minister of finance in the Spanish cabinet is dead.

SOCIALISTS PROBE RESPONSIBILITY FOR STARTING THE WAR

BERNE, Feb. 3.—Responsibility for the great war will be investigated by a commission appointed by the socialist conference in session here, it was decided today. This commission will be made up of two British, two French, one Hungarian, one Austrian and two German delegates, with President Hjalmar Branting acting as a member. Carl Kautsky, a German delegate, renewed his attack against the German majority socialist party, saying: "Minority socialists who protested against the terms of the Brest-Litovsk and Bucharest treaties, have today the right to claim just treatment for the German people. Germany must be fed. She must be given an opportunity to get work and avoid troubles which will lead to a re-renaissance of Bolshevism." Dr. Friederich Adler of Vienna accused the former Austrian government of having "systematically worked for the war."
