NEW DORMANT SPRAY COMMENDED BY COUNTY AGENT

For San Jose scale, Blister Mite, Aphid Eggs, etc., the following spray combination is believed to be more efficient for controlling scale and other insects than the old standard lime sulphur spray, and I hereby recommend the following combination to growers interested in this line for your consideration:

Lime Sulphur, Oil, Glue Combination Materials used: Standard lime and sulphur, testing 32 degrees Beaume.

To make up 200 gallon tank:

1st. Emulsify two gallons (this is a minimum) dormant soluble oil and pour into tank (if other brands of oil emulsion are used, use one-sixth of the amount recommended for regular dormant work, for instance six gallons of dormant soluble oil are recommended for 100 gallons of dormant spray. Other brands may carry recommendations of 10 or 12 gallons for dormant spray, and where 12 gallons are recommended to the 100 gallons, we would use one-sixth of that or 2 gallons to the 100 gallons or 4 gallons to the tank of 200 gallons), then add sufficient water to the tank to make about 175 gallons.

2d. Add 1 1/2 to 2 lbs. of dissolved glue to this diluted emulsion with agitator running. (Note: Glue should have been dissolved previous to time of spraying. This may be done by placing 50 lbs. of glue into a barrel that will hold about 50 gallons, then fill the barrel with water and allow to stand for a few days, stir it at odd times. Dissolving of the glue can be facilitated by using warm water, but do not use boiling water. Where the glue has been prepared in this manner, one gallon of the solution will contain one lb. of glue. One lb. of glue should be the minimum for a 200 gal. tank, 1 1/2 to 2 lbs. to the 200 gallon tank may be used.

3d. After the spray tank has been filled to about 175 gallons and the glue has been added with agitation then add 20 gallons of lime sulphur, keep up good agitation and spray immediately. This combination is especially recommended in old orchards and in young orchards where San Jose scale and Blister Mite have gained a foothold. The oil emulsion acts as a spreader for the lime sulphur and more scale will be killed as a result of this increased spreading which makes it possible to obtain better penetration thru and under the scale that attach themselves very securely to the bark of the tree.

POINDEXTER'S PROPHECY.

NO ARGUMENT is advanced by Senator Poindexter against the proposed league of nations that has not already been answered by former President Taft. Poindexter's appeal is to prejudice rather than reason—in line with most of the utterances of this ambitious four-flusher since he was stung by the presidential bee.

Poindexter is, if nothing else, a man of steadfast convictions and far sightedness. In 1896 he was the most blatant of Bryanites and beheld a vision of national ruin almost equal to that he sees in a league of nations, unless free silver was adopted at the sacred ratio of 16 to 1. A little later he was back eating at the republican pie-counter, only to leave the G. O. P. with a few years on account of its wickedness and follow Roosevelt to Armageddon—but through the wreckage of the party, landed in the senate, where as an uncompromising progressive he noisily played the role of Satan rebuking sin. When the good Bull Moose ship was scuttled, he hastily climbed aboard the republican band wagon and is now the most rabid of standpatters.

Mr. Poindexter compares the league of nations to a Bolshevik soviet and strenuously waving the American flag, feverishly appeals to patriots to save "the prize jewels in the American diadem of state."

The league of nations represent the honest effort of the best brains and wisest statesmanship of the world to bring the nation's together in an effort to prevent future wars and establish a democratic peace—to provide a basis upon which an edifice of international good-will can be reared and that will make impossible hereafter the slaughter of ten million men to gratify the imperial lust of monarch or nation. But it would not make any difference what it sought to accomplish, or how it aimed to ameliorate the condition of humanity, it would be opposed by self-seekers like Poindexter,—whose myopic vision is obscured by the projection of themselves and who are obsessed with their own barren achievements and lured, they care not where, by the vanity of their vaulting ambition.

NO VICTORY LOAN.

THERE will be no fifth issue of liberty bonds—no "Victory loan" as it was to have been termed, under an agreement reached by the house ways and means committee and the secretary of the treasury. Instead a series of short term notes will be issued, at interest rates to be fixed by congress.

The existing liberty loan legislation authorizes the issue of five billion dollars of liberty bonds at 4 1/4 percent interest. In the opinion of the secretary and of the congressman, this interest rate is insufficient to float the bonds successfully. Bonds of the previous issues are now selling at a discount that yields 4 1/2 to 5 per cent on the investment and, without the patriotic stimulus of the war, it is questionable whether a fifth loan could be floated successfully at the old interest rate.

Instead of bonds, a series of short term notes will be issued, probably bearing a higher rate of interest, and maturing in a few years. These will make an excellent investment and should market themselves by the aid of the banks, although it may be necessary to use the machinery of the liberty loan drives in an effort to market these federal notes.

NITRATE OF SODA NOW IN TRANSIT

Within a few days 15 tons of nitrate of soda, purchased for the farmers of Jackson county of the government through the new county farm bureau, at a saving of \$30 a ton over the market price, will be shipped to Medford from San Francisco.

This news was contained in a letter received by C. C. Cate today from Fred N. Nelson of San Francisco, government director of nitrate of soda for the Pacific coast. Mr. Nelson writes that he will make the shipment in even weight sacks of 200 pounds each.

The 15 tons has all been sioned up and will arrive in plenty of time for spring use. Roland Flaherty, assistant county agricultural agent, has been appointed the county nitrate of soda distributor. It is expected that more nitrate will be ordered by the farmers.

WANTS ARMY SENT TO FIGHT BOLSHIEVIKI

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—As a substitute for the resolution of Senator Johnson of California, urging the withdrawal of American troops from Russia, Senator McCumber of North Dakota introduced a resolution today declaring it to be the duty of the United States and its allies to send immediately to Russia a sufficient army to defeat the "murderous bands known as Bolsheviki" in order to enable the Russian people to establish a stable government.
