

FIGHTING 27TH HOME FROM WAR

NEW YORK, March 11.—With 85 officers and 2674 troops of the 27th division—former New York State National guardsmen—the steamship Mount Vernon arrived here today from Brest. The vessel brought together 5784 troops, including a large number of casualties and 90 nurses, together with seven officers and 813 men sick or wounded.
