ALLIED LOSSES ARCHANGEL REGION EXTREMELY LIGHT

ARCHANGEL, March 13.—(By the Associated Press.)—As a result of the recent allied advance southward along the Murmansk railroad...

Compared to the losses inflicted on the enemy, allied casualties in fighting along the Vaga river since February 28 have been extremely light.

American casualties from February 28 to March 9 inclusive, were five killed on the Vaga front and 10 on the Dvina front.

The health of the expeditionary forces since the Spanish influenza epidemic in September and October has been excellent.

Throughout the fighting, American troops have generally been greatly outnumbered but losses inflicted upon the enemy have been at least five times those suffered by the Americans.

ENEMIES OF THE REPUBLIC.

JOHN REED, socialist writer, former Bolshevik consul at New York, at an address in Cleveland, stood with upraised hands and swore that "either Gene Debs would get out of jail or we would all get in."

There is no reason in the world why Debs should get out of jail and every reason why Reed should get in. Why he is not there is hard for patriotic Americans to understand...

The admitted aim of Bolshevism for which Mr. Reed is employed is the destruction of the American government by a bloody class war and installation of a reign of terror similar to that prevailing in Russia...

In his farewell speech, before his departure to begin serving his sentence for violation of the espionage act, Eugene Debs, the socialist leader, thrice a candidate for the presidency, removed whatever doubt lingered in the minds of Americans who love their country regarding the justice of his sentence...

How many American socialists are actuated by these alien and un-American ideals is difficult to say—but probably not many. The socialist party in America was split by the war. Part, led by Berger and Debs were openly pro-German and disloyal.

The Bolsheviks, comprising the radical socialists, the I. W. W. and the anarchists, make a good deal of noise, but are not numerous. Most of them are foreigners, who left their own country for its good, and now seek destruction of the land that furnished them an asylum.

There is plenty of room in our prisons for these undesirable citizens seeking destruction of the government by force—and plenty of ships available for the deportation of the undesirable aliens to their native lands—but there ought to be no room in our lecture halls or on our street corners for these enemies of the republic.

PROBE BRAVERY STORIES TOLD BY MEDAL WINNER

LONDON, March 14.—The investigation of the stories of the remarkable exploits of Captain Edmund G. Chamberlain of San Antonio, Tex., an officer of the United States marine corps, which has been in progress for several weeks, has developed to the extent that the American naval authorities consider a court martial necessary.

The court martial, it is announced, will investigate chiefly whether Captain Chamberlain's recommendations for decorations were all forgeries and whether there was any truth whatever in his story of destroying an extraordinary number of machines in a short time.

Captain Chamberlain, then a lieutenant, was recommended for the Victoria Cross and the congressional medal of honor, the highest awards for bravery of Great Britain and the United States, August 31, 1918, for an exploit on the preceding July 20, over the British front in a battle with 12 German machines. Chamberlain, it was reported, destroyed five enemy planes and damaged two others.

POLAND TO KEEP ARMY OF MILLION

LONDON, Mar. 14.—The Morning Post prints a highly interesting message from its special correspondent in Warsaw, describing the sitting of the Polish constitutional assembly last Monday at which an important decision took place. This was the passage unanimously of the military bill calling upon all men born between 1896 and 1901. Supplemented by the six hundred thousand for which this bill provides, the Polish army will number close to one million.

The Polish peasantry, declared one of their representatives, will demand a strong and powerful army so long as the Bolsheviks invaded Polish territory, the Ukrainians attack eastern Galicia, and the Germans refuse to give up Danzig and Silesia.
