## ASK EXCLUSION OF IMMIGRATION

WASHINGTON, March 25.—Senator Jones of Washington, republican, today sent a cablegram to the American peace delegation in Paris urging that the proposed league of nations constitution be amended so as to specifically exclude the league from control over immigration, naturalization and other domestic questions. The senator sent the cablegram in compliance with a telegraphic request made by Senator Phelan of California.

"I endorse the cable of Senator Phelan relating to immigration, naturalization, etc.," said Senator Jones' message, "and go further and insist that compact exclude such questions from inquiry."

Senator Jones also sent a telegram to Senator Phelan endorsing his attitude. Senator Henderson of Nevada, democrat, also replied to Senator Phelan in a similar manner.

## YANKS TO CONTROL LUXEMBURG - ALSO

COBLENZ, March 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—Word was received at the headquarters of General Dickman here today from general headquarters that the Duchy of Luxemburg will on April 1 be included in the area under the control of the American Third Army, the irradication

of which will extend to the French frontier of 1914. The Sixth corps, commanded by Brigadier General Adalbert Cronkhite, will function in the Luxemburg area with the Fifth and Thirty-third divisions which have been attached to the second army. General Cronkhite is expected to take his headquarters at Luxemburg soon. This city also being the general headquarters of Marshal Foch. The control of this additional territory will give the Third Army the third, fourth and sixth corps, with nine divisions.
