

THRIFT PRIZES FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN JACKSON COUNTY

The following contest is open to all students in the schools of Jackson county. Experiences to be related in compositions not to exceed 300 words in length and to cover the period of time between Jan. and Nov. 1st, 1919:

First prize: A \$5 W. S. S. certificate will be given to any boy or girl for the most novel method or actual experience related, in earning money with War Stamps as purchased between January 1st, 1919 and November 1st, 1919. The facts to be submitted to the county school superintendent in a report of not to exceed 300 words by November 1st.

Second prize: A \$5.00 W. S. S. certificate will be given to any boy or girl for the most ingenious or original method of raising money that is invested in War Savings stamps between January 1st and November 1st, 1919. Facts to be submitted to the county school superintendent in a report of not to exceed 300 words by November 1st.

Third prize: A \$5.00 W. S. S. certificate will be given to any boy or girl for the hardest work performed (time put in, kind of work and results considered) in selling W. S. S. between January 1st and November 1st, 1919. Facts to be submitted to the county school superintendent in a report of not to exceed 300 words by November 1st.

Ten prizes of \$1.00 each in Thrift Stamps: Ten single prizes of \$1.00 each will be given in Thrift Stamps to each of ten boys or girls whose reports are considered the next best, most interesting and best written. Each of these \$1.00 prizes will be awarded in Thrift Stamps to those boys and girls holding thrift cards. The object of this is to help Thrift card holders fill up their cards.

A committee of judges will be appointed by the county school superintendent to decide upon the successful contestants. The contest will be open to all schools in the county.

Judges in considering the results and making the awards will take into consideration statements indicating real self-denial in the experiences of the contestants.

Points for judging:
Novelty.....10
Ingenuity or originality.....10
Hardest work—results.....30
Composition.....25
Elements of sacrifice.....15
Human interest.....10
Total.....100

It is hoped that the object lessons gained, and the experiences of the contestants related in stories will prove to be the most interesting human interest stories that our schools have produced, and that they will aid in promoting the principles of, and give practical encouragement to, habits of thrift.

PLANT 100 ACRES IN CRATER FOREST TO PINE AND FIR

PORTLAND, April 11.—In 1959 the trees which will be planted this week and in the near future under the direction of George Coell, district forester, will be ready for the market according to estimates of the forest service here today.

Planting was started in four Oregon forests and one national forest this week. Directions have been given to plant with fir and pine 2030 acres of national forest which have been burned off a number of times and which would produce no new trees if left to nature. Planting is to take place on 100 acres near Rutlers Creek on the Crater National forest, on 425 acres near Oakridge, southwest of Eugene, on the Cascade National forest, on 500 acres at Mount Hebo, south of Tillamook in the Sluslaw National forest, and on 525 acres on the old Seldie Burn on the Olympic national forest.

Trees two years old are used for planting. The trees were all grown on the Windy river government nursery in the Columbia national forest and are of Douglas fir except those to be planted on the Crater forest,

which are yellow pine, and grown at a nursery in that forest. It is expected that within 20 years the timber planted this spring will be large enough to be used for piling and post timber.

BROADWAY TERRIER KING FALLS DOWN STAIRS, IS KILLED

NEW YORK, April 11.—George W. Quintard, for 10 years a spectacular figure on Broadway, who specialized in the breeding and training of Fox terriers, died today from injuries received by falling down a flight of steps leading to a roof garden.

He inherited \$1,000,000 from his father in 1908. After marrying the daughter of a White Plains boarding house keeper, who divorced him in 1916, he married a Chicagoan.

After appearing in two breach of promise suits he was sued by a Fifth avenue jewelry concern for purchases totalling \$65,000. His answer was that, being intoxicated at the time, he could not be held accountable.

At his kennels in Auburndale, he bred such stars of dogdom as Ruby Dazzler, Matford Vic, Wireboy of Paigton and Holmsbury.

After being divorced by his second wife in 1917, Quintard went to France as an artilleryman in the American expeditionary forces. He was recently mustered out.
