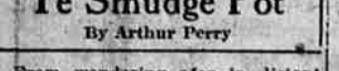

THE POLITICAL MIX UP.

THE criticism which President Wilson is suffering at the hands of his own party members is nothing short of astounding. The Portland Journal a few days ago carried a front page story from its Paris correspondent, in which the president was severely criticised for not taking the people into his confidence, for playing a lone hand, needlessly antagonizing elements necessary to his success, and thus allowing slander and suspicion to grow unchecked.

It is not probable the Portland Journal would have displayed this story on its front page, unless it had some sympathy with the contents.

The Philadelphia North American recently printed an interview with the veteran democrat and editor Colonel Henry Watterson, which for personal vindictiveness and uncompromising hostility toward the country's chief executive, has, we believe, never been approached by any critics of the opposition, even in the heat of political controversy.

The article is too long to quote in full but here is a brief extract which indicates its general temper:

A virtuous, right-minded man thus situate would emulate the humility of a Washington and the humanity of a Lincoln. Mr. Wilson sees nothing but himself and his personal exaltation; lives for nothing except his own advantage; seeks nothing save power and authority, the concrete things of rulership represented by the regal splendors and feudal glories, which, though somewhat frayed and faded, still go on about him.

Colonel Harvey of the North American Review, has been a life long democrat, was the discoverer of President Wilson, and as far as we know has never, changed his politics, but he is now leading a campaign against the president and the League of Nations, more virulent, malicious and pitiless, than anything to be found in the so-called opposition press.

But perhaps the most convincing evidence of this complete reversal of political fealty, this utter extinction of old political lines, is furnished by the two latest publicity sheets of the republican and democratic parties. The republican sheet displays the statements of Colonels Watterson and Harvey, the democratic sheet has its leading article devoted to extracts from a recent speech by former president Taft, endorsing President Wilson and the League of Nations!

Not only Oregon but Jackson county must fly with its own wings. The P. & E. railroad is a local problem and with \$30,000 from eastern interests, Medford and Jackson county must do the rest.

Instead of complaining about the reparation demands Germany might better be grateful that it can pay in money instead of agony and blood.

BANKHEAD URGES MORE GOOD ROAD BUILDING

MINERAL WELLS, Tex., April 15.—Addressing the seventh annual meeting of the United States Good Roads Association today, Senator Bankhead of Alabama, retiring chairman of the senate postoffice committee urged further improvement of American roads, extension of the Bankhead national highway from El Paso to San Diego, or Los Angeles, Calif., and the education of highway engineers by colleges.

Senator Bankhead said that when the war demonstrated the inadequacy of railroad transportation, use of the motor truck and automobile was resorted to, showing the necessity for better roads.

ADMIRAL MAYO TO CONFER REGARDING OCEAN FLIGHT

WASHINGTON, April 15.—Admiral Henry T. Mayo, commander-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet, who arrived yesterday in New York, will come to Washington tomorrow to discuss with the navy department officials the arrangement and location of warships in the Atlantic ocean for the overseas flight of naval seaplanes next month.

F. M. WARREN LEAVES FOR EAST, MEETING OFF

PORTLAND, April 15.—Because Frank M. Warren, a member of the state fish and game commission which is under fire from the Oregon Sportsmen's League and the Multnomah Anglers' club has been called east unexpectedly the hearing of charges against the commission, which Governor Olcott had set for next Friday, will be postponed indefinitely, it was stated today. The governor will issue a call for another meeting as soon as Commissioner Warren returns.

GEN'L RICHARDSON REPORTS ALL WELL IN NORTH RUSSIA

WASHINGTON, April 15.—Brigadier General W. P. Richardson, the new commander of the American forces in north Russia, has reported the military situation satisfactory in his first official dispatch since landing on the Murmansk coast.

The message sent to General Pershing and relayed by him today to the war department was dated April 13, or about two weeks after the mujik conduct of Company I, 339th infantry, which refused to go to the front from Archangel.

It is assumed here that a satisfactory military situation means that proper discipline prevails among the American troops generally.

General Richardson reported the occupation on April 11 of Oros Ozoro by a force of Russians supported by the allies. As a result of this action 46 of the enemy were killed, nine wounded and 26 taken prisoner, two field guns, one machine gun and 7,000 shells being captured. The allied casualties comprised one Canadian sergeant killed and one French sergeant wounded.

"Am leaving with headquarters staff and replacement officers April 14 for Archangel," the general's message said. "Expect to arrive in about six days."

MORE OUTRAGES BY POLES AGAINST JEWS REPORTED

STOCKHOLM, April 15.—Fresh complaints from Poland regarding the treatment of Jews in parts of that country have been received by the Jewish Press Bureau here. The plundering of Jews by marching bands of robbers is reported and lack of protection by the authorities is complained of.

Selection of the remaining members of the provisional Korean cabinet was announced here March 4.

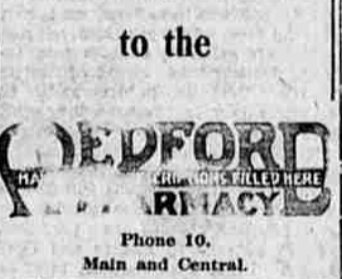

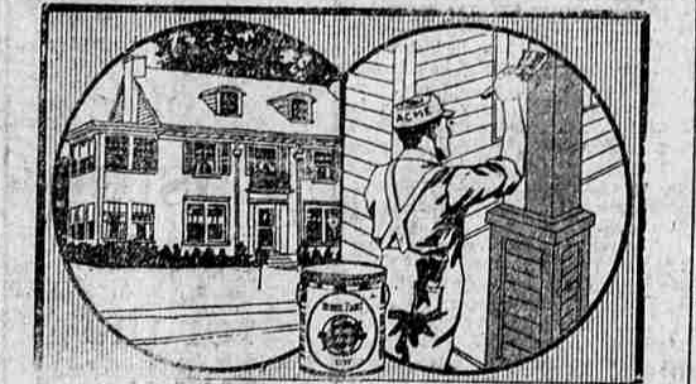

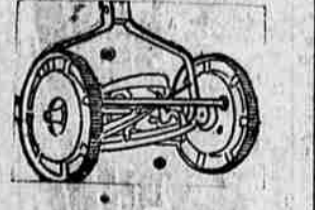
