### MONDAY MORNING FROST DID NO MATERIAL DAMAGE

The frost of Monday morning did no commercial damage to the valley's fruit crop according to County Agricultural Agent Cate, who yesterday afternoon visited various parts of the valley and received reports from all sections. Of course there was costly damage done in some of the low lying orchards, but on the floor of the valley there was none to speak of considering the big crop of all kinds of fruit. It would take several such frosts of similar intensity to affect the crop, in Mr. Cate's opinion.

There was no frost this morning nor any danger of one as Frost Expert Young predicted early Monday evening. Despite his positive prediction a number of orchardists, notably in the Central Point region, alarmed by Monday morning's frost, for a time last night feared its repetition. The minimum temperature of this morning was 38.

The orchardists can sleep sweetly tonight, for no frost whatever is in sight, the prediction for tonight and Tuesday being probable showers.

### DOWAGER EMPRESS DUKE NICHOLAS INCONSTANTINOPE

PARIS, April 15.—Twenty members of the former Russian imperial family, including former Dowager Empress Marie Feodorovna reached Constantinople from the Crimea several days ago, according to the Echo de Paris. The party also included the former Grand Duke Nicholas Nicholasievitch, at one time commander-in-chief of the Russian army, and Peter Nicholasievitch, lieutenant-general in the Russian imperial army and a younger brother of Nicholas.

Nicholas and Peter, who married sisters of the Queen of Italy, having been invited to reside in Rome, have left Constantinople for the Italian capital.

The others of the party, including the dowager empress, will go to Malta where they will await the decision of the British government as to their future place of residence.

### AMERICAN D. A. R. PLEDGES SUPPORT TO PEACE LEAGUE

WASHINGTON, April 15.—Enactment of a federal law to prevent general misuse and desecration of the American flag was advocated in a report today to the 28th congress of the Daughters of the American Revolution, in session at Continental Hall here.

Mrs. James P. Hume, state regent of Wisconsin, chairman of the flag committee, reported that the evil had increased very greatly since the armistice.

The most frequent misuse of the flag, Mrs. Hume declared, was by magazines, and in cartoons and posters. In the latter days of the war and particularly since the armistice and with the returning home of troops the public, she said, had used the flag for costumes and decorations in such a way as to arouse the resentment of patriotic organizations.

A resolution endorsing the League of Nations was presented. It went to the committee without comment on the floor.

### EMPLOYEES BLAMED FOR R. R. WRECK

WASHINGTON, April 15.—A rear-end collision between two New York Central trains near South Byron, N. Y., last January in which 21 persons were killed and 71 injured, was due, according to a report today by the bureau of safety of the interstate commerce commission, "to failure of Engineerman Friedly of train No. 11, properly to observe and be governed by automatic block signal indications. Contributing cause was the failure of Flagman Groves to go back a sufficient distance properly to protect his train and to display lighted fuses as required by rules."

### SEND 6 CARLOADS BEANS TO STARVING ARMENIANS

SAN FRANCISCO, April 15.—Six carloads of California beans and one carload of rice will be sent to the starving peoples of Armenia, according to Dr. F. W. Fisher, a member of the American committee on relief in the Near East here today.
