

CITY COUNCIL GIVES \$15,000 VICTORY LOAN

Also Vote \$5,000 Investment in Former Liberty Loan—Money Taken From Water Fund Surplus—Hill Succeeds Carkin—Latter Praises Work of Administration.

When the city council convened last night John H. Carkin, councilman from the second ward, at once handed in his resignation and A. L. Hill of the Woods Lumber company was immediately sworn in and took his seat. Another important feature of the council meeting was the council voting to invest \$15,000 in the new Victory bond issue and \$5,000 in one of the former Liberty bond issues.

Mr. Carkin's retirement the council loses one of its ablest and hardest working members, and gains in his place one of the city's best known business men whose selection meets with general approval. Mr. Hill is very familiar with city affairs and took hold as a city official at last night's meeting like an old timer. He will take Mr. Carkin's place on the finance and water and fire committees.

Praises Administration
It had been known for some time that Mr. Carkin would resign, and the selection of Mr. Hill and his acceptance was agreed on a week ago. In his formal resignation Mr. Carkin in a written communication praised the administration of Mayor C. E. Gates and the present council, reviewing their arduous labors and various steps pursued in connection with refinancing the city and putting it on a sound financial basis.

Use Surplus Water Funds
In unanimously voting for the investment of \$20,000 of the city funds in Liberty bonds the council instructed the city recorder and treasurer to make this investment as follows: \$15,000 in Victory loan bonds, and \$5,000 in bonds of one of the prior Liberty loans to be purchased in the open market at a price not higher than the prevailing market price; taking for this purpose \$10,000 from the depreciation water fund and \$10,000 from the accumulating surplus water fund and investing \$75,000 from each fund in the Victory loan.

Mr. Carkin's formal resignation addressed to the mayor and council reads as follows:
"I hereby tender my resignation as councilman from the second ward to take effect immediately. In doing so I am not unmindful of the duty of each doing his part in public service but having served for over two years I have done so at a sacrifice to my business and while it has been a pleasure to do my bit I feel that I should now pass on the burden to other shoulders.
