

BIDS FOR BUILDING 32 MILES ROAD IN JACKSON COUNTY

SALEM, April 25.—When the state highway commission meets in Portland on May 6, it will open bids for \$1,750,000 on the additional road work in nine counties of the state.

The contemplated road work which is a part of the commission's gigantic program for this year includes the following:

Douglas county—Comstock to Pass Creek, grading and macadam, one mile; Leona to Drain, grading and macadam, 3.25 miles; Jacques Place to John's Place, grading and macadam, 7.2 miles; Roseburg to Dillard, grading and macadam, 6.7 miles; Oakland, south, grading and macadam, 1.2 miles; Roseburg to Winchester, grading and macadam, 2 miles.

Jackson county—Gold Hill to Josephine county line, grading and paving, 12.2 miles; Ashland to Green Springs road, grading and paving, 5.85 miles; Green Springs road to California state line, paving, 14.8 miles.

Josephine county—Sexton Mountain section, grading, 7.6 miles.

PROFESSOR GRIGGS GOES IN SEARCH OF "BALLOON GAS"

WASHINGTON, April 25.—Word received by the National Geographic society that the sixth expedition of the society, headed by Professor Robert F. Griggs, to explore the famous Valley of Ten Thousand Smokes has arrived at Kodiak Island, Alaska, opposite the extensive volcanic area about Mount Katmai.

Professor Griggs headed the society's expedition to the Katmai district in 1916. The following year he discovered the volcanic area there which has been called one of the greatest natural wonders of the world and which has been set aside by President Wilson as a national monument.

This year the party includes chemists, a petrographer, a zoologist, other scientific men, and motion picture photographers.

Effort will be made to determine whether helium, the non-inflammable gas which is expected to revolutionize the science of ballooning, is to be found about Katmai.

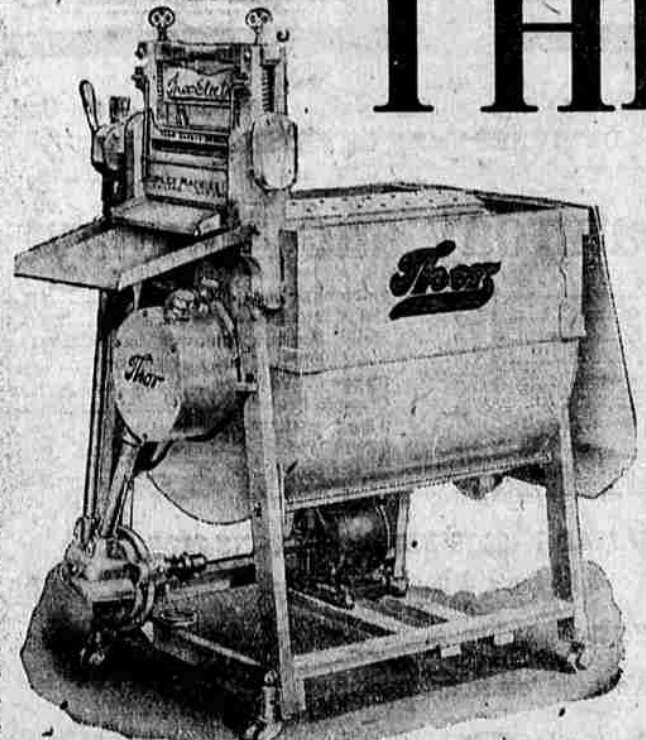
