# SODA WATER TAX KEEPS LOCAL SOFT DRINKERS JUMPING

Medford patrons of soda fountains received a severe shock Thursday and today when after ordering and consuming their favorite soft drinks they found they were charged a war tax thereon. They had forgotten all about the revenue bill containing this feature passed months ago by congress and which went into effect May 1st. And later on, visiting the drug stores and finding that there was also a tax on patent medicines, toilet articles and the like, and the clothing, dry goods, and furniture stores and finding the war tax on luxuries in force they became positively peeved.

or toilet preparation costing from 25 cents to a dollar and more. The old gentleman also requires his war tax on men's and women's hats, clothing and shoes above a certain price. The law governing soft drinks, ice cream and the like, reads as follows: "Of the amount paid at any soda fountain, ice cream parlor, etc., for drinks known as soft drinks mixed at the place, or for ice cream sodas, sundaes, or similar articles of food or drink, when sold in or near such place of business, for each 10 cents or fraction paid, a tax of one cent to be paid by the consumer." The keeping track of this war tax on sales will cause no end of bother to the soda fountain proprietors. All five cent drinks are now six cents, ten cent drinks and dishes 11 cents, fifteen cent drinks and dishes 16 cents, and so on.

The war tax on patent medicines and toilet preparations is 4 per cent on the dollar. All 25 cent preparations now cost 26 cents, 50 cent ones 52 cents, and dollar ones \$1.04. There is a war tax of 4 per cent on films, 10 per cent on kodaks and 10 per cent on fountain pens. There is also a ten per cent on certain kinds of clothing and furniture, and on all shoes in excess of \$10 in price.
