WHEN ALL THE

Medford people as well as strangers in the city noticed something radically wrong in the business district today and puzzled a little to figure out what was the matter before discovering that most of the store display windows had their curtains down. The people then wondered what for.

This strange action on the part of these store proprietors will be revealed at 9 o'clock tonight when after all lights are turned out in the streets for one minute and are turned on again the store windows, with raised blinds, will shine forth in emblazoned splendor as one of the opening features of the Victory week celebration. The windows are closed today while the decorations are being arranged.

You must be down town tonight to enjoy the Victory week doings. Every body else and his or her cousin will be there. Besides the fun you will have several opportunities to pick up spending money. So leave the cat and dog at home to watch the house, cover the canary bird, for you may not be home until late, and come down town to enjoy the Victory week festivities on this fine May night.
