

CHARGE WILSON IS BEHIND MOVE TO DETACH IRELAND

LONDON, May 6.—The visit of representatives of American Irish societies to Ireland—M. J. Ryan and E. F. Dunne—is creating great interest in Sinn Fein circles there and equal indignation in unionist quarters in Ireland and England. Among the reports in circulation is one that passports from Paris to Ireland were granted the mission at the request of President Wilson.

There is considerable mystery about the whole affair and it is unknown whether Premier Lloyd George has been in communication with the visitors at all. There is one report that he promised to receive them but has cancelled his engagement.

A question was addressed to the government in the house of commons on Monday with a view to establishing whether the envoys are accredited to the American government and also to establish their exact status. It also was asked if the premier had intended to receive them. The question was met evasively by the home secretary who promised to make inquiries and said that this would occupy a week.

"If it is true that Mr. Wilson is behind this intrigue against the union of the United Kingdom—and after the president's behaviour toward Italy anything is credible—the American ambassador," says the Post, "ought to be told that the United Kingdom does not tolerate interference in its domestic affairs. They are our business and the business of nobody else."

The Graphic says: "If any of the states of America were again to demand the right to secede from the Union, it is certain the American people would be bitterly indignant if such a demand received any kind of official encouragement from Great Britain. We apply the same standard."

DRINK CURE DOCTORS TO QUIT BUSINESS

CHICAGO, May 6.—Plans are being made by owners of more than 200 drink cure institutions to discontinue business with the coming of national prohibition according to officials of institutions here. A few of the places may continue indefinitely as drug cure sanitariums, but a large majority is expected to close within a year.

James E. Bruce, an official of a drink cure corporation that advertises it has cured more than 500,000 victims of alcohol, said the prohibition wave had for some time caused decreased business.

"A few years ago we had 60 branches in operation throughout the country. Today we have 26. Drug cases constitute about 25 per cent of our business, the number being about the same as before the Harrison anti-drug law went into effect five years ago. But we do not think it would pay to continue treating drug cases alone."

SCHOOL CHILDREN OF STATE ASKED TO SAVE 'OREGON'

PORTLAND, May 6.—To the school children of Oregon would be offered the privilege of saving the battleship Oregon from the ignominy of official junking, thru a plan submitted to Mayor Baker by Monroe Goldstein, assistant to the selective draft executive of Oregon.

The plan, having in purpose the participation of every child enrolled in the public schools of the state in the creation of a fund for the preservation of the famous battleship, has met with the hearty approval of Mayor Baker, who, in turn, has submitted the details to Governor Olcott.

Goldstein proposes that during the present school year every child of every age, in every public school in Oregon contribute "a penny a week" to a fund to be known as the "save the Oregon fund." The contribution would end at the final payment of 45 installments, after which each child contributing would be furnished with an engraved certificate of appropriate design bearing a facsimile signature of the trustees of the fund and constituting a certification that the holder co-operated in saving the battleship Oregon for posterity.

Mayor Baker in approving the plan stated that he believed that at least 75 percent of the 150,000 pupils enrolled in the schools of the state will be delighted to participate in such a patriotic movement. Thus, he explained, in excess of 150,000 could be raised, which would insure adequate funds for the maintenance of the Oregon during the time intervening before the next session of the legislature.
