Supt. Berrian also has a proposition figured out to put in an electric plant, the power to be furnished by a water wheel, that will not only provide lights for the building but lights will be arranged over the ponds to attract bugs at night for the fish to feed on.

FIUME WILL GO TO ITALY IN 1923; SLAVS GET PORT

PARIS, May 7.—As a basis of resuming participation in the peace negotiations, Premier Orlando accepted a proposal that Italy administer Fiume as a mandatory of the League of nations until 1923, after which Fiume will revert to Italian sovereignty.

During the Italian administration a harbor for the Jugo-Slavs will be built at a port lower down the Adriatic coast. The harbor will have railroad communication with Agram and other cities.

Italy, it is understood, also is prepared to make sacrifices of some of her other claims on the Dalmatian coast.

The proposal which induced the Italians to return to Paris was made to them by Camille Barrere, the French ambassador at Rome.

by the allied and associated powers as operative, and by Germany in principle, but without membership. Similarly, an international labor body is brought into being with a permanent office and an annual convention.

Certain problems are left for solution between the allied and associated powers, notably details of the disposition of the German fleet and cables, the former German colonies, and the values paid in reparation.

The preamble names as parties of the one part the United States, the British Empire, France, Italy and Japan, describes as the five allied and associated powers, and Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, China, Cuba, Ecuador, Greece, Guatemala, Haiti, the Hedjaz, Honduras, Liberia, Nicaragua, Panama, Peru, Portugal, Rumania, Serbia, Siam, Czechoslovakia, Poland and Uruguay.

Peace When Signed "It states that: Bearing in mind that on the request of the then imperial German government an armistice was granted on November eleventh nineteen eighteen, by the five allied and associated Powers in order that a treaty of peace might be concluded with her, and whereas the allied and associated powers being equally desirous that the war in which they were successfully involved directly or indirectly and which originated in the declaration of war by Austria-Hungary on July 28th, nineteen fourteen, against Serbia, the declaration of war by Germany against Russia on August first, nineteen fourteen, and against France on August third, nineteen fourteen, and in the invasion of Belgium, should be replaced by a firm, just and durable peace, the plenipotentiaries, (having communicated their full powers found in good and due form) have agreed as follows:

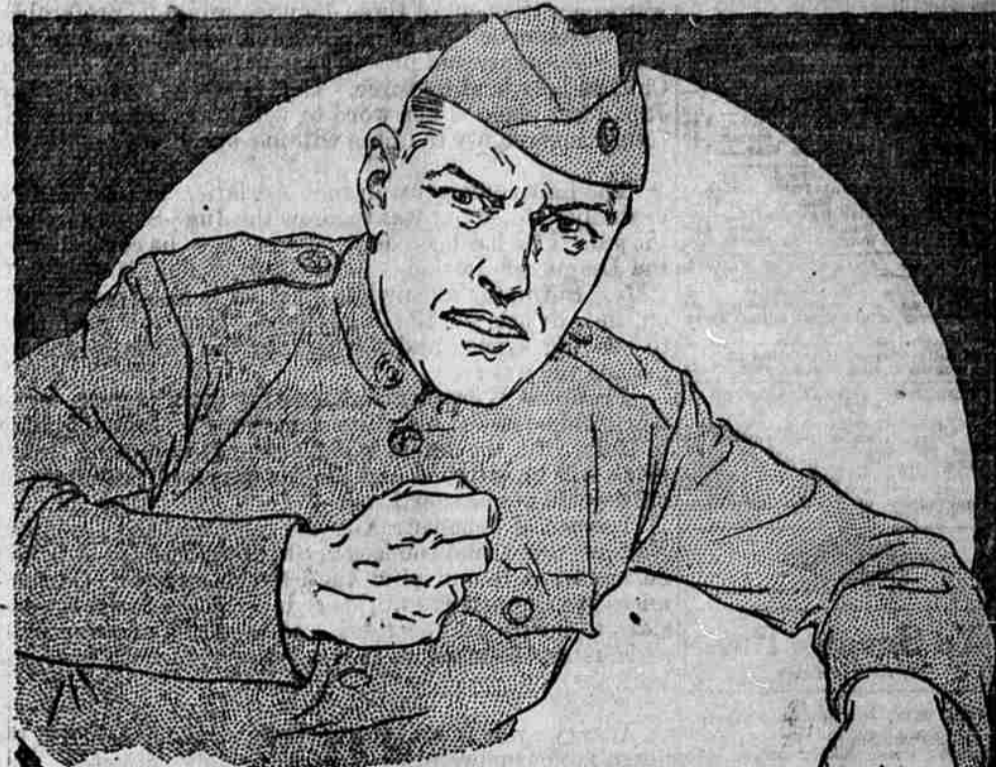
present treaty the state of war will terminate. From that moment and subject to the provisions of this treaty official relations with Germany, and with each of the German states, will be resumed by the allied and associated powers.

Belgian Flies to Peace Meet. PARIS, May 6.—Paul Hymans, Belgian foreign minister, left Brussels in an airplane at 1 o'clock this morning and reached here at 2 p. m. in time to attend the plenary session of the peace conference.
